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Supply List: "Clam Up" Bag

Pattern Requirement:

"Clam Up" by Patterns by Annie

Fabric: (Note: Try to avoid directional fabrics)

I will be demonstrating on the XL size, you may choose the size you like but I suggest making the M, L or XL size.

Main Fabric – 1 fat quarter

Lining – 1 Fat quarter

"Soft and Stable" – One 18" x 58" package – one package will make all 5 bags in the pattern

Handbag Zippers:

M, L – One 20" or longer double slide handbag zipper

XL – One 24" or longer double slide handbag zipper

OR

One package of By Annie "Zippers by the Yard" – Highly recommended!
You can make all five sizes with one package and have 50" of zipper tape leftover for other projects

Tools Required:

Thread to match your fabrics and zippers

Rotary cutter

Ruler (at least 6 ½" x 24" in length)

Clover Clips – These are important! You will need these to keep the pieces together while sewing as the layers are too thick for pins. The clips come in either a 10-pack or 50-pack. I feel it's worth it to invest in the 50-pack because you will find these clips indispensable for any project that involves thick layers. Also fantastic for attaching binding to a quilt.

Stylus – Wonderful to use to keep thick layers and zippers straight while sewing the pieces together. You can use a seam ripper instead but a stylus works much better.

1 pkg size 90 Topstitch sewing machine needles

Pins

Marking pencil or chalk (my favorite is the Clover Chaco liner marker in white, yellow or gray)

Notes: The pattern comes with a \$5 coupon for a video that highlights the construction of the bag. I strongly recommend using the coupon and viewing the video before class begins to get a better understanding of how this bag is made.

If you are bringing your own machine, please bring, if available, a ¼” foot and an edge stitch foot.

If you are a **BERNINA** owner and your machine uses the feet with the “red” numbers, and you are using one of our machines or bringing your own, please bring a #37 (1/4” foot) and, if you have one, #10 (edge stitch foot). We have a few available to use, but we are in short supply.

Before Class Homework:

Trace or copy the pattern for your selected bag size. Trace onto regular paper, plastic quilting template material, freezer paper or tracing paper. If you decide to print a copy on your printer, use regular paper. There is a product that contains letter-size freezer paper sheets you can use in the printer– check with the shop to see if we have it in stock.
