Double Cut Circle Quilt Supply List

This technique, originally developed by Sandi Cummings, is a wonderful way to explore free-spirited, improvisational style. We'll create 2 blocks at a time, resulting in "mirror image" blocks. We will also make transitional strips that will facilitate arranging your blocks into a striking how-did-she-do-that kind of quilt!



Supplies:

- Sewing Machine in good working order
 - Foot control and power cord
- Accessories
 - 1/4" piecing foot
 - Open toe foot
 - Free motion foot
- Needles
 - Schmetz size 80/12 sharp needle
- Thread
 - 50wt. Cotton thread to blend with your fabric
- Notions
 - Cutting mat, ruler, and rotary cutter
 - Bring any acrylic circle templates that you may have, or purchase Fiskars' Circle Seam cutter. We'll be making circles between 4"-11" in circumference.
- Fabric
 - Block backgrounds: Several Fat Quarters (FQ), selecting high contrast fabrics, and a variety of small, medium, and large scale prints for each set of blocks
 - 2 contrasting strips for EACH FQ, cut 2 1/2"-3" wide and 13"-15" long.
 These strips can be cut in class, once you have decided which background fabric(s) you'll be using. Black and whites here and there can add pop and zing!
 - Circles: Fabrics 12" square minimum. Again, THINK CONTRAST!! We'll
 use 1-2 circles per FQ. I sew my circles onto my background fabric, but if
 you prefer to fuse yours, bring light weight fusible, as it stiffens the block. If
 sewing yours, choose thread to match/blend or contrast...whichever look you
 like best!
