



Supply List for 1st Saturday: Alaska Instructor: Pat Vasaio

This quilt uses wedges and Lemoyne star blocks to create a stunning design. While there are templates to use with this pattern and there are pre-cut kits available, I will be using The Wedge Ruler by Studio 180. This technique makes it easy to create these blocks, however it does require additional fabric. In addition, the Wedge will enable you to resize the blocks easily. As with all Studio 180 rulers, you make the components oversized and then trim to the exact measurement.

Fabric amounts needed to make the quilt as shown in the pattern (9" finished blocks), adjusted for using the Studio 180 Wedge Ruler:

- Fabric 1 (light): 2-7/8 yard
- Fabric 2 (medium): 1-1/2 yard
- Fabric 3 (light blue): 1-1/2 yard
- Fabric 4 (medium blue): 3/8 yard
- Fabric 5 (dark blue): 1-1/2 yard
- Fabric 6 (very dark blue): 1 yard
- Border (light): 1-1/8 yard
- Binding (light blue): 2/3 yard
- Backing: 4-1/4 yard

If you use the templates, I recommend adding 1/4 yard over the listed amounts on the pattern for each of the fabrics to allow for any cutting or sewing mistakes.

If you use the pre-cut kit, mark 1/4" along the seam line corners so your intersects are exact. Also, make one block to make sure your 1/4" is exact and your block measures 9.5". A fellow quilter was using the pre-cut kit at a recent retreat, and her blocks measured only 9". In addition, her Lemoyne star blocks had peaks and valleys. I will go over in class how to correct this common error.

I will discuss using the templates in class, but my main focus will be on using The Wedge Ruler. Please email me (vasaio@comcast.net) if you plan to alter the block size and need help adjusting the fabric requirements.
