

Complete Course of Quilting Supply List

Introduction

This 10-week quilting course teaches everything you need to know to start making your own quilts. This course covers the basics: getting to know your sewing machine, rotary cutting, fabric selection, and a variety of techniques for machine piecing quilt blocks. You make a sampler quilt and learn to sandwich, quilt, and bind your masterpiece. This is the perfect opportunity to explore the quilter's art, which is both ancient and modern!

Finished size of sampler quilt: $40 \text{ in. } \times 50\%$ in.

Skill level: Beginner

Know before you sign up:

Most classes are a combination of discussion, demonstration, and practice. You must have a sewing machine in good working order. If your machine has not been serviced in the past year, please have it cleaned and oiled. Capital Quilts can clean and oil many brands of sewing machines; allow two weeks or more for servicing.

In addition to 10 group classes, you will have a one-hour private session with the instructor at Capital Quilts where you will be given the textbook and some practice supplies. You must bring your sewing machine to the private session, so the instructor can review the machine's operation and make sure you are comfortable using it. As time allows, the instructor can help select fabric and supplies for the class.

Once you have registered, the instructor will contact you to schedule your private session.

Be ready to bring your sewing machine, cutting mat, and all supplies with you each week.

Supplies

Fabric

During your private session, the instructor can assist with fabric selection (Capital Quilts staff can help at other times). If you have selected any fabrics for your quilt, bring them to the private session. Fabric must be high-quality, 100% cotton for satisfactory results.

By the end of the private session:

- 2 yards of theme fabric for blocks and borders (a good theme fabric incorporates at least 4 or 5 colors to help you coordinate the other colors)
- 6 to 8 assorted fat quarters that coordinate with your theme fabric. Select light, medium, and dark colors in small, medium, and large scale prints. Tone-on-tone, florals, geometrics, stripes, even plaids will also work. (You will probably add more fabrics as you see your quilt come together.)

For later in the course:

5/8 yard for sashing (the strips between the blocks)

1% yards for the quilt backing

3/8 yard for binding (may be your theme fabric)

Required Tools

 Sewing machine in good working order, with power cord, foot pedal, all presser feet, and manual
 ¼ in. foot (generics available at Capital Quilts)
 Walking foot (generics available at Capital Quilts)
 Schmetz sewing machine needles, size 80/12, Microtex or Sharp
 Neutral thread (light tan or light gray), 100% cotton, 50 wt (Aurifil or Superior Pima)
 Bobbin filled with neutral thread
 Removable marking pencil (chalk pencil, Frixion pen, air- or water-erase pen)
 Rotary cutter, 45-mm, with a new blade installed, plus extra blades
 Cutting mat (18 in. x 24 in. is most useful)
Long Ruler, 6 OR 6.5 in. x 24 in. (Olfa or Creative Grids)

Sowing & Creativity Center

Large square ruler, 9.5 in. \times 9.5 in. OR 12.5 in. \times 12.5 in. (Olfa or Creative Grids)
Small sewing scissors
Seam ripper
Silk (very thin) straight pins
Quilter's Magic Wand (for half-square triangles)
Portable design wall
Fabric glue stick or Elmer's glue stick
Mary Ellen's Best Press or other spray starch
Optional Items
Throughout the class, the instructor will introduce tools that make tasks easier. You ma buy them as you need them.
Stiletto or tailor's awl (either sharp or rounded point)
Betty Bridge Supreme, from Steady Betty (to improve seam accuracy)
Small square ruler, 6 in. x 6 in. OR 6.5 in. x 6.5 in. (Olfa or Creative Grids)
Grippers for rulers (to keep them from slipping)
Add-A-Quarter ruler (for foundation paper piecing)
Strip Stick (for pressing)
Curved Safety Pins OR 505 Spray Baste (for basting quilt sandwiches)
Wonder Clips <mark>(f</mark> or founda <mark>tion</mark> paper piecing and for binding)
Quilter's gloves

Capital Quilts Policies for All Classes

- Please do not bring visitors to class.
- Be sure to check your supply list before class. Bring all supplies with you.
- If you must cancel the class, your fee can be refunded ONLY if you have notified us at least seven days before the class. The refund will be a store credit. If someone on the waiting list can fill your place, you will receive store credit for the fee, even if you have not notified us by the deadline.
- Capital Quilts reserves the right to cancel a class due to insufficient participation. We require at least two people in a daytime class and three in an evening class. If we cancel the class for this reason, you will receive a full refund of the class fee. (You can avoid this situation by getting a friend to sign up with you!)
- If Capital Quilts cancels the class for any reason, including inclement weather, you will receive an email advising you of this situation. We also post store closings on our website, www.capitalquilts.com, and on Facebook. If the class is rescheduled, you will be invited to come to the new class before the class is opened to public registration. In the event you cannot take the rescheduled class, you will receive a full refund of the class fee.
