

Ruby Apron Your Way! Supply List

The Ruby Apron from Rebecca Ruth Designs is as fun as it is functional! It looks fantastic in any striped fabric, but you can also mix it with prints or solids for the bib, straps, and pocket facing. The straps cross over at the back like a French smock apron. The pattern has an optional back belt, but you can use ties instead. There are lots of ways to customize this apron!

In the first class session, we will focus on fabric and design options, so you can choose your customizations. Then we will prepare the pattern pieces so you can cut them out at home. You don't need to have your fabric selected when class starts – there will be time to shop during class when you have selected your customizations. In the second class, we will sew the pieces together to make a finished apron.

Supply List

- Ruby Apron pattern
- Sewing machine in good working order with power cord and foot pedal (not needed for first class)
- Thread and full bobbin
- Needles: 80/12 Microtex or Sharp
- Rotary cutter, large ruler, and cutting mat
- Craft scissors, fabric scissors, and small sewing scissors
- Marking pens & pencils, including one chalk marker
- Sewing supplies: seam ripper, pins, seam gauge
- Roll of tracing paper or freezer paper, preferably 18 in. wide

Optional

- Bias tape maker (to make your own)
- Clover Hot Ruler Press Perfect, 2.5x10 in. (to make narrow hems)

Fabric

Unless you already have fabric you want to use, you should wait buy these items during or after first class, when we have reviewed the design options:

- 2 yards striped fabric OR 1½ yards striped fabric and ½ yard print fabric
- Bias tape: 1 yard, unless you are making your own
- Velcro: for straps, two pairs 1 in. long (optional: for back belt, one pair 1 in. long)
- Optional for apron strings: 1½ yards ribbon that is at least 1½ in. wide

Capital Quilts Policies for All Classes

- Please do not bring visitors to class.
- Be sure to check your supply list before class. Bring all supplies with you.
- If you must cancel the class, your fee can be refunded ONLY if you have notified us at least seven days before the class. The refund will be a store credit. If someone on the waiting list can fill your place, you will receive store credit for the fee, even if you have not notified us by the deadline.
- Capital Quilts reserves the right to cancel a class due to insufficient participation. We require at least two people in a daytime class and three in an evening class. If we cancel the class for this reason, you will receive a full refund of the class fee. (You can avoid this situation by getting a friend to sign up with you!)
- If Capital Quilts cancels the class for any reason, including inclement weather, you will receive an email advising you of this situation. We also post store closings on our website, www.capitalquilts.com, and on Facebook. If the class is rescheduled, you will be invited to come to the new class before the class is opened to public registration. In the event you cannot take the rescheduled class, you will receive a full refund of the class fee.
- Classroom sewing machines are available for rental during a class. There is a \$10 fee per class session. Quantities are limited, so please ask to reserve a machine as soon as possible. Plan to come to the shop early on the day of class so that we can show you how to thread and operate the machine.
