

Flap Pouch

Finishes approximately 6 1/4" x 3 1/4" x 2 1/2"

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

Outer Fabric A: 9.5"x 4" and 9.5" x 7"

Outer Fabric B (bottom): 9.5" x 4.5"

Lining Fabric: 9.5"x 13.5"

Fusible Fleece: 9.5" x 13.5"

Vegan leather scrap approximately 1" x 2.5"

Closure of choice: Magnetic snaps/Velcro/snaps

Decorative label or woven ribbon

Matching thread and general sewing supplies

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Flap Pouch

Inspired by the Stationery Pouch by Minki Kim for Bernina

- With right sides together, insert lining to main piece. Sew all around.



- Clip each flap at back corner for ease of opening/closing the pouch. Turn right side out through lining opening. Press. Stitch lining opening closed by machine or hand.



- Top stitch front and flap edges. Sew label/ribbon.
- Install closure of choice to bag front and flap if magnetic snaps were not installed before lining.

Simple Flap Pouch

Necessities:

- Outer Fabric A: 9.5"x 4" and 9.5" x 7"
- Outer Fabric B (bottom): 9.5" x 4.5"
- Lining Fabric: 9.5"x 13.5"
- Fusible Fleece: 9.5" x 13.5"
- Vegan leather scrap approximately 1" x 2.5"
- Closure of choice: Magnetic snaps/Velcro/snaps
- Decorative label or woven ribbon
- Matching thread and general sewing supplies

Instructions:

- All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ inch. Backstitch at beginning and end of each seam.
- Cut outer fabrics (cutting sizes listed on back of pattern). Sew long edges (9.5") together with print B in the middle. Press seams open.




- Tape together pattern pieces matching solid lines on Print A to Print B. Cut fleece using taped pattern.
- Fuse cut fleece to the wrong side of fabrics, aligning seams to pattern piece. Topstitch 1/8 inch from each seam.


- Draw $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance on wrong side of outer fabric all the way around fleece. Cut fabric on drawn line.



- Cut lining fabric using this fused fabric piece as the pattern. Set aside.



- Stitch side seams right sides together, inserting leather scrap piece into a side seam.



- Box out corners by pinching them, then stitching bottom seams.




- If using magnetic snaps, insert them to center flap and front, following manufacturer directions.
- Stitch lining in the same manner as outer fabric but leave an opening at one of the side seams to turn.



Stationary pouch Pattern


*Actual size

*Add 1/4" seam allowance.



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
