## Teddy Bear and Doll Quilts

Quilts for stuffed animals and dolls can be as simple or as complex as you want. A finished size of $18^{\prime \prime} \times 18^{\prime \prime}$ to $24^{\prime \prime} \times 24^{\prime \prime}$ will be large enough to wrap most animals or dolls.

General Instructions: Simplest construction is done pillowcase fashion, with no separate binding. Piece the top in a pattern of your choice. Baste the top to a piece of batting, then trim away any excess batting. Place the top right sides together with the backing fabric, so that the batting is facing up. Stitch all around, with a $1 / 2 \prime \prime \prime$ seam, leaving a $6^{\prime \prime}$ opening for turning. Trim the corners and turn the quilt right side out. Press carefully, and topstitch all around about $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime \prime}$ in from the edge. This will close the opening. Quilt as desired.

Some design ideas:

## The Checkerboard:

The easiest quilts to make use squares stitched together randomly or in a pattern, with or without borders. Cut the squares $4^{\prime \prime}$ or $5^{\prime \prime}$. Thirty $4^{\prime \prime}$ squares sewn in a $5 \times 6$ checkerboard will make a quilt that is about 18 by 20 inches.

## Strip quilts:

Another easy option can be made with leftover $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. Strips cut $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ long can be stitched into a simple pattern known as Rail Fence. Twelve Rail Fence blocks will make a quilt 18" by 24".
