

2000 Smile Spinners

─ FABRIC AND SEWING BOUTIQUE ←

Yarn Dyed Scarf

MATERIALS:

2 1/2 yd Yarn-Dye, Homespun, Woven Stripe or Plaid *Fabric with a width of 42" will make up to 4 scarves!

1 spool High quality thread (all purpose poly)

CUT:

- Cut the selvages off of both sides
- Cut 4 strips lengthwise, each about 10" wide*
- Customize the length to each person
 - 90"= extra long scarf, 81"= long scarf, 72"= average scarf

FRINGE:




fig.1 Fringe the edges by removing threads

- Pull threads out from all edges, using an awl, seam ripper point or a pin to tease them out if needed, (fig. 1)
- Continue until the desired fringe is achieved.
 - A 1/2" fringe length will create an elegant look.

STITCH*:




fig.2 Stitch 1/8" inside the fringe. You can add a second row of stitching OR none at all!



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

- To stabilize the edge, stitch 1/8" in from the fringe. Use a standard straight stitch length of 2.5mm (fig.2).
- If you want your stitching to blend in, use a matching color thread. Using a contrasting color thread becomes a fun accent!
- You can do one or several rows of stitching to stabilize the fringe

*Stitching the edge is optional! Many yarn dyed fabrics are tightly woven and will not continue to fray while being worn making this a really easy gift to make if you don't have a sewing machine or are creating with kids

TIE:

 Put your scarf on and tie it as you like! There are so many ways to wear a simple scarf like this and it will add character to any outfit, making it an excellent gift!
