

Hummingbird Bouquet

Pattern available at Quilters Quest and fabric according to pattern

Neutral color of sewing thread

Sewing Machine in good working order, $\frac{1}{4}$ " piecing foot

Basic sewing supplies- tape, pins, seam ripper, scissors, paper cutting scissors, paper, post it notes, mechanical pencil, Gallon size zip bags

Glue Stick

Marking/tracing pencils

Rotary cutter and your favorite rotary cutting ruler, cutting mat

Add-A-Quarter Ruler and Brass Strip

Optional:

Rotating cutting mat, Stripology Square Ruler or June Tailor Shape Cut

Quilt Savvy Ruler

Lunch or a snack

In advance of class: Make copies of foundation patterns (pages 6-11 on regular copy paper) and templates (pp 1-5 on paper side of freezer paper) so that you don't use up the original patterns in case you want to make again. Cut out the templates neatly on the line. Cut the foundations out but leave a 1/8 inch all the way around the foundation, do not cut on the line. The alphabet tags are also very helpful, make a copy and cut those out, too.

Pieces C1, C2, C3 just the 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. W cut 8, 6 $\frac{3}{4}$ x 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ ". F&G cut 3, 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

The rest of the cutting will be done in class.

If you would like to make a miniature version of Hummingbird Bouquet, I will walk you through the process of doing this later, on your own. You will still need the full-size pattern. Except for the pinks, I was able to eek my miniature out of the leftover scraps from the full-size fabric requirements, but it was tricky. Add another $\frac{1}{2}$ yard of background fabric so you don't have to work so hard, also an extra eighth yard of the pinks for the flowers.
