2 versions of this quilt have been created. One is easier to cut because the snowman borders are in one piece on each sides. Any changes in the instructions for Version 2 are indicated in RED. All other points will be the same.

Fabric Requirements

33757P-X Panel	1 Panel
33759-X Snowman Stripe	1 1/2 Yards
33761-3 Blue	1/4 Yard
33761-1 Red	1 Yard
33761-2 Green	1/2 Yard
33761-4 Dark Blue	1 1/2 Yards
33760-X Multi	3/4 Yard
33762-1 Red (binding)	1/2 Yard
33758-X multi (backing)	4 1/2 Yards

Initial Cutting Instructions

33757P-X panel Fussy cut the large scene adding 1/4" all the way around the candy stripe for seam

allowance. The cut rectangle should measure 18 1/4" wide and 23 1/2" long. Fussy cut 6" squares with 2 snowmen and 2 Christmas trees centered in the

33761-2

squares.

33759-X Snowman Stripe Fussy cut two strips of snowmen 4 1/2" X 36 1/4". Note: This will require using

alternate rows of snowmen losing a row inbetween.

Fussy cut 22 snowmen from the fabric 4 1/2" X 4 1/2". This will require using alternate snowmen to get units required. If making Version 2, fussy cut four strips of the snowmen.

33758-X Scenic Fussy cut your 4 favorite scenes in 6" X 6" squares.



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33761-1 Red Cut six strips 2" X WOF.

Cut four strips 2 1/4" X WOF Cut two strips 4" X WOF

33761-3 Blue Cut three strips 2" X WOF

33461-2 Green Cut three strips 2" X WOF

Cut two strips 4" X WOF

33761-4 Dark Blue Cut six strips 2" X WOF

Cut four strips 2 1/4" X WOF Cut eight strips 3" x WOF

33760-X Multi Cut 7 strips 3 1/2" X WOF

33762-1 Red Cut 7 strips 2 1/2" X WOF

These WOF strips will be sub-cut in the assembly steps.


Making the Inner Stripe Borders

Cutting

Sub-cut four 2" strips of 33761-1 Red into one strip 18 1/4" long and one piece 23 1/2" long. Sub-cut four 2" strips of 33761-4 Dark Blue into one strip 18 1/4" long and one piece 23 1/2" long. Sub-cut two 2" strips of 33761-3 Blue into one strip 18 1/4" long and one piece 23 1/2" long. Sub-cut two 2" strips of 33761-2 Green into one strip 18 1/4" long and one piece 23 1/2" long.

Assembly

Using one 18 1/4" strip each of the 33761-2 Green and 33762-3 Blue and two 18 1/4" strips of 33761-1 Red and 33761-4 Dark Blue make a 9 1/2" X 18 1/4" strip set as shown below.



Repeat this for the other set of 18 1/4" strips and for both sets of 23 1/2" strips.

Making the Corner Blocks

Cutting

Sub-cut eight pieces 6" from the 2 1/4" strips of 33761-1 Red. Sub-cut eight pieces 9 1/2" from the 2 1/4" strips of 33761-1 Red Sub-cut sixteen pieces 4" from the 4" strips of 33761-2 Green





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
Assembly

Sew a 6" piece of 33761-1 Red to the top and bottom of a fussy cut Christmas tree block. Next sew a 9 1/2" piece of 33761-1 Red to each side, you now have a 9 1/2" X 9 1/2" block.





Place a 4" square of 33761-2 Green on each corner RST and align the raw edges. Draw a diagonal line on the back of each square and sew on the line as shown. Flip the triangles open, press and trim the excess leaving a 1/4" seam allowance on the back. Repeat for the other tree square and the 2 snowman squares.



For the scenic corner blocks follow the same procedure substituting the fussy cut scenes from the all over design as the centers and 33761-4 Dark Blue for 33761-1 Red and 33761-1 Red for 33761-2 Green. Make four scenic corner blocks.

Making the Snowman Stripe Borders

Cutting

Sub-cut four of the 3" strips of 33761-4 Dark Blue to 41 1/2". Sub-cut four of the 3" strips of the 33761-4 Dark blue to 36 1/4".

Assembly

VERSION 1

Sew eleven of the fussy cut $4\ 1/2$ " X $4\ 1/2$ " snowmen from the 33757-X fabric together to form the vertical snowman stripe. The stripe should measure $4\ 1/2$ " X $41\ 1/2$ ". Sew one strip of the $41\ 1/2$ " 33761-4 Dark Blue to each side of the snowman stripes made above to form the side snowman border. This unit should measure $9\ 1/2$ " X $41\ 1/2$ ". Make two.

VERSION 2

Sew a 41 1/2" strip of the 33761-4 Dark Blue to the top and bottom of a 41 1/2" strip of snowman stripe to form the side border. The units should measure 9 1/2" X 41 1/2". Trim the stripe to measure. Make two. BOTH VERSIONS

Sew a 36 1/4" strip of 33761-4 Dark Blue to the top and bottom of the 36 1/4" snowman stripe to form the top and bottom snowman border. The units should measure 9 1/2" X 36 1/4". Make two.

Making the Candy Cane Swirl Border

Sew the 3 1/2" X WOF strips of 33760-X fabric together using diagonal seams to form one long strip. Cut two strips 75" and two strips 70".



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Final Assembly of the quilt

- -Sew the 18 1/4" striped inner borders to the top and bottom of the center panel.
- -Sew a Christmas tree block to the top and a Snowman block to the bottom of one of the side 23 1/2" striped borders being careful of orientation. Repeat for the second border reversing the tree and snowman blocks.
- -Sew the side inner border with the corner block in place.
- -Sew the 36 1/4" top and bottom snowman borders in place.
- -Sew the scenic corner blocks to the top and bottom of the snowman side borders.
- -Sew the snowman border/scenic corner block units in place for the version you are making.

Find the center of each swirl border strip and the center of each side of the quilt. Align the centers and sew on each side stopping 1/4" from the corner. Miter the corners.

Quilt and bind your quilt using the 2 1/2" strips cut earlier. ENJOY!
