

Cutting Instructions:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. Strips are cut across the width of fabric (perpendicular to selvedges) unless otherwise stated. All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam unless otherwise stated. Label all pieces.

From Fabric A:

1. Cut six 12 1/2" blocks centering design within each one.

From Fabric B:

- 1. Cut one 2 1/2" strips; subcut four 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles and two 2 1/2" squares. (Tree Blocks)
- 2. Cut one 4" strip; subcut five 4" x 7 1/2" rectangles. (Flying Geese)

From Fabric C:

1. Cut two 4" strips; subcut six 4" x 7 1/2" rectangles. (Flying Geese)

From Fabric D:

- 1. Cut ten 1 1/2" strips; subcut twelve 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangles and twelve 1 1/2" x 14 1/2" rectangles. (Panel & Tree Blocks)
- 2. Cut seven 2 1/2" strips. (Binding)

From Fabric E:

1. Cut one 4" strip; subcut five 4" x 7 1/2" rectangles. (Flying Geese)

From Fabric F:

- 1. Cut one 2 1/8" strip; subcut four 2 1/8" x 5 5/8" rectangles. Cut two rectangles diagonally in half and cut remaining two rectangles diagonally in half in opposite direction. (Tree Blocks)
- 2. Cut two 2 1/2" strips; subcut eight 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles, eight 2 1/2" squares, four 2 1/2" x 3" rectangles and four 2 1/2" x 4" rectangles. (Tree Blocks)

- 3. Cut one 3 1/2" strip; subcut four 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" rectangles and eight 3 1/2" squares. (Tree Blocks)
- 4. Cut seven 4" strips; subcut forty-eight 4" squares and eight 4" x 7 1/2" rectangles. (Flying Geese)
- 5. Cut six 2 1/2" strips. Sew strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Press seams open. From this pieced strip, cut two 2 1/2" x 52" strips and two 2 1/2" x 66" strips. (Inner Border)

From Fabric G:

- 1. Cut three 1 1/2" strips; subcut four 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangles and four 1 1/2" x 14 1/2" rectangles. (Panel Blocks)
- 2. Cut seven 1 1/2" strips. Sew strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Press seams open. From this pieced strip, cut two 1 1/2" x 54" strips and two 1 1/2" x 70" strips. (Middle Border)
- 3. Cut one 2 1/2" strip; subcut two 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles and two 2 1/2" x 9 1/2" rectangles. (Tree Blocks)
- 4. Cut one 3 1/2" strip; subcut two 3 1/2" x 7 1/2" rectangles and two 3 1/2" x 9 1/2" rectangles. (Tree Blocks)

From Fabric H:

1. Cut one 3 3/4" strip; subcut four 3 3/4" x 5" rectangles. With rectangles positioned vertically, cut from bottom left corner to top center. Cut opposite side from bottom right corner to top center to make four isosceles triangles.

From Fabric I:

1. Cut four 6 1/2" repeats along length of fabric (parallel to selvages). Trim two strips to 66".

Piecing Instructions: Tree Block Section

1. Aligning seam points, sew one 2 1/8" x 5 5/8" F triangle to one side of one 3 3/4" x 5" H triangle. NOTE: If you find it challending to match the seam points, draw a scant 1/4" on the back side on all sides of each triangle. Where the lines cross is the seam point. Be sure to match seam points, not the tips of the triangles which are different angles. Press seam open and trim ends of F triangle even with edges of H triangle. Repeat for opposite side of H

triangle. Repeat to make four units (Figure 1).

2. Sew one 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" F rectangle to both sides of one 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" B rectangle. Press seams toward the center. Repeat to make four units

Figure 2

- Sew one unit from Step 1 to one unit from Step 2. Press seam open or to one side. Repeat to complete four small tree units (Figure 3).
- 4. Draw a diagonal line on the reverse side of one 2 1/2" F square. Place right sides together at one end of one 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" G rectangle. Sew on the line and trim seam to 1/4". Press seam toward the resulting triangle. Place another marked F square at opposite end of rectangle. Sew, trim, press. Sew one 2 1/2" x 3" F rectangle to both ends of the unit and press toward the rectangles. Repeat to make two units (Figure 4).

5. Draw a diagonal line on the reverse side of one 3 1/2" F square. Place right sides together at one end of one 3 1/2" x 7 1/2" G rectangle. Sew on the line and trim seam to 1/4". Press seam toward the resulting triangle. Place another marked F square at opposite end of rectangle. Sew, trim, press. Sew one 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" F rectangle to both ends of the unit and press toward the rectangles. Repeat to make two units (Figure 5).

6. Draw a diagonal line on the reverse side of one 3 1/2" F square. Place right sides together at one end of one 3 1/2" x 9 1/2" G rectangle. Sew on the line and trim seam to 1/4". Press seam toward the resulting triangle. Place another marked F square at opposite end of rectangle. Sew, trim, press. Repeat to make two units (Figure 6).

7. Draw a diagonal line on the reverse side of one 2 1/2" F square. Place right sides together at one end of one 2 1/2" x 9 1/2" G rectangle. Sew on the line and trim seam to 1/4". Press seam toward the resulting triangle. Place another marked F square at opposite end of rectangle. Sew, trim, press. Repeat to make two units (Figure 7).

8. Sew one 2 1/2" x 4" F rectangle to both sides of one 2 1/2" B square. Press toward the center. Repeat to make two units (Figure 8).

- 9. Referring to Figure 9, sew together one unit each from Steps 4-8 in order. Press seams open or to one side. Sew together two units from Step 3. Sew small tree unit to large tree unit and press seam open. Repeat except reverse position of units.
- 10. Sew one 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" D rectangle to both sides of block. Press toward the rectangles. Sew one 1 1/2" x 14 1/2" D rectangle to the top and bottom of the block. Press toward the rectangles. Repeat to complete two tree blocks. Sew blocks together vertically (Figure 10). Press seams open.







Flying Geese Sections

- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the reverse side thirty-two 4" F squares. With right sides together, place one marked square at one end of one 4" x 7 1/2" C rectangle. Sew on the line and trim seam to 1/4". Press seam toward the resulting triangle. Place another marked F square at opposite end of rectangle. Sew, trim, press. Repeat to make six units (Figure 11).
- 2. Repeat Step one using five 4" x 7 1/2" B rectangles and five 4" x 7 1/2" E rectangles (Figure 11).

3. Sew one 4" F square to both ends of three F/C units, three F/B units and two F/E units (Figure 12).

4. Sew one 4" x 7 1/2" F rectangle to the right side of two F/C units and two F/E units (Figure 13).



5. Sew one 4" x 7 1/2" F rectangle to the left side of one F/C unit, two F/B units and one F/E unit (Figure 14).

Quilt Assembly:

- 1. Sew one 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" D rectangle to both sides of one panel block. Press toward the rectangles. Sew one 1 1/2" x 14 1/2" D rectangle to the top and bottom of the block. Press toward the rectangles. Repeat to make four framed panel blocks (Figure 15).


Figure 16 Make 2.

- 2. Repeat Step 1 using G rectangles with remaining two panel blocks (Figure 16).
- 3. Referring to quilt diagram, sew flying-geese sections to both sides of the tree section. Press toward the center.

- Referring to quilt diagram for placement, sew three framed panel blocks into a row. Press away from center. Repeat to make second row.
- 5. Sew a panel block row to the top and bottom of the center section. Press seams open or to one side.
- 6. Sew together one 2 1/2" x 52" F strip, one 1 1/2" x 54"

- G strip and one 6 1/2" x 66" I strip centering strips to each other. Press toward the I strip. Repeat. Beginning and ending a generous 1/4" from the ends of the quilt, sew one border set to top and bottom of the quilt centering borders to center of quilt. Press toward the borders.
- 7. Repeat Step 6 using 2 1/2" x 66" F strips, 1 1/2" x 70" G strips and 6 1/2" x LOF strips. Sew one of these border sets to the both sides of the quilt. Press toward the borders.
- 8. Close corners of borders with mitered seams. Trim seams to 1/2" and press open.

Finishing:

- 1. Prepare backing using vertical seam/s. Press seams open and trim backing to 68" x 82".
- 2. Layer quilt, batting, and backing. Baste layers together.
- 3. Quilt as desired.
- 4. Trim layers even with quilt top.
- Join seven 2 1/2" D binding strips with diagonal seams.
 Press seams open. Attach binding using your favorite method.
- 6. Make a label and sew to the back of the quilt.




Quilt Diagram
