

Edge to Edge Quilting on Your Embroidery Machine

If you want to finish a quilt quickly, make a quilt completely on your own, or see what else you can do with your embroidery machine, you will love this class. The Easy-Connect Quilting files and technique allow you to use your embroidery machine to get quilting results like you'd see from a long-arm quilter. Choose from ten edge to edge quilting designs in the booklet.

Supply List

- A quilt top, backing and batting ready to quilt. Baby quilt or small wall hanging is ideal to get started. This should be pin basted prior to class. The backing should be 5-6" larger on each side than the front. So a 20"x20" top should have backing 30"x30".
- A small sample quilt sandwich for testing tensions big enough to fit in your hoop
- Stabilizer cutaway that's kind of sheer, Stabilglider works well (available at GSC). Enough for two hoopings
- Quilting thread regular sewing thread or 40wt thread is good. Best to avoid heavy threads like King Tut to begin with.
- A dark thread like red or navy blue to create templates
- Marking pencil, either white chalk or blue wash away marker which ever will show up best on your quilt top
- Permanent, fine point marker like a Sharpie
- Embroidery machine and module
- The largest embroidery hoop you own with its plastic template and clips
- Long quilting ruler (like 24" ruler)
