

Supply List for Fun, Fast, Fusible Applique Class

1. The Booklet: ART TO HEART: IMAGINE by Nancy Halvorsen
2. Soft Fuse: at least 1/3 yard
3. Pencil and Eraser
4. Scissors – Treat yourself to a pair with a sharp point, and serrated edges like the Karen Buckley scissors.
5. Applique Pressing Sheet
6. Sewing Machine in good working order
7. Straight Stitch foot AND Applique foot
8. Usual sewing supplies (seam ripper, extra needles (size 80 and size 90), pins, etc.
9. **Threads:** You will need regular thread for piecing the background together. However, you might want to switch to a heavier (40 weight) more decorative thread to use for the appliqués. Isacord or King Tut are good choices.

Fabrics:

Each month you will need 3 different background fabrics. The exact size varies slightly from month to month, but fat quarters or 1/3 yard pieces work well. Applique pieces vary in size so bring some larger scraps to use. **If you wish, use the booklet to guide your fabric choices. However, you are free to dig in your scrap bag and use whatever works for you.**

JANUARY: Backgrounds: 2 different dark blues, 1 white. Appliques: White for Snowman, blue, turquoise, red, orange, green in small scale prints. Additional fabrics for hat, scarf, eyes, arms, nose, and snowflakes.

FEBRUARY: Background in red and white and/or pink and white prints. Appliques: ¼ yard for large heart and letters (this fabric should read as a solid). Additional red and white prints for other 2 hearts.
