

Sewing Machine Presser Feet / Accessories Bag

A place to store all your presser feet, small accessories and sewing supplies.


Customize its pockets to hold what you want to put in it.

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

PLEASE READ BEFORE YOU CUT

- See Page 3 for chart identifying the pieces to be cut, pieces A through J.
- As you cut, label each cut piece with the piece letter (A thru J) and the piece dimensions.
- All of the cut pieces are rectangles. Use a rotary cutter and acrylic ruler for accurate cutting.
- DO NOT cut any bias binding strips. These will be cut when needed during construction.

OUTER BAG FABRIC (42" wide x 54" long):



BATTING for outer bag


From 'hard' batting, such as 'In-R-Form', cut 2 A pieces (13" x10") and one C piece (11"x5")

From 'soft' but firm (not lofty) batting, such as Quilters Dream Poly, cut two B pieces (37"x3"), two E pieces (24" x 1 ¾") and 1 F (21"x3") piece.

Cut one D piece (13"x9") from either the 'soft' or the 'hard' batting. The 'hard' batting will create a more structured pocket side; the soft batting will create a more flexible side. Either will work nicely for the bag.

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LINING FABRIC



BATTING for Pocket Pages

NOTE: Use the 'hard' batting (ex. In-R-Form) for a firmer page or use 'soft' batting (ex. Quilters Dream Poly) for a softer page.

From batting of choice cut **three** G pieces, (19"x11"), i.e., one piece for each of the three pages. (Note: if using In-R-Form, you should be able to cut 3 from the 58" width of the batting)

ORGANZA or VINYL 'POCKET' FABRIC (54-60" wide x 36" long)

H – 4" x width of fabric (54-60")

J – 13" x 10"

Note: Piece "I" can be cut from Lining fabric

instead of organza or vinyl.

Note: Piece "J" can be cut up to 12" high (i.e., 13 x 12), to add a

bottom pleat for fullness to the pocket.

The Bias strips for binding will be cut 2 ½" wide but wait to cut them until the bag is complete except for the binding. You may want to 'audition' the width to be sure it is correct. Different seam allowance widths or heavier vs lighter weight fabrics may effect how wide these strips need to be cut.

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Pieces Identified


- A Outer Bag Sides

 Cut from outer bag fabric and from lining fabric
- B Main Bag Zipper Bands Cut from outer bag fabric and from lining fabric
- C Handle Band Cut from outer bag fabric and from lining fabric
- D Outer Pocket Side


 Cut from outer bag fabric and from lining fabric
- E Outer Pocket Zipper Band Cut from outer bag fabric and from lining fabric
- F Outer Pocket Band
 Cut from outer bag fabric and from
 lining fabric
- G Pocket Page (inside bag)


 Cut from lining fabric
- H Pocket Strips for page Cut from organza or vinyl
- I Large Inside Pocket StripCut from organza or vinyl or lining fabric
- J Larger Zippered Inside Pocket

 Cut from organza or vinyl
