

Pansy Series Supply List

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We will interpret a photograph of a pansy in four different methods, crayon, collage, threadwork and appliqué. Students need to be reasonably comfortable with free motion quilting.

Supplies:

4 - 9"x9" squares of white cotton material (I use Kona cotton)
4 - 10"x10"squares of cotton material for the backs (I used white Kona)
4 - 10"x10" squares of cotton batting (I use Warm and White)
A light box (if you have one)
White cotton thread (I use 50 weight)

Pansy #1

Water-soluble blue marker
Crayons (I use Prang but Crayola will also work)
Transparent thread (I use Sulky)

Pansy #2

An assortment of scraps of fabric to realistically recreate the pansy of your choice
Lightweight fusible (I use Heat n Bond light)
Small scissors for detail cutting

Pansy #3

Water-soluble lightweight stabilizer (I will provide this)
Black cotton thread (I use 50 weight)

Pansy #4

An assortment of fabrics and DMC floss to recreate the pansy of your choice
(I used 1930's reproduction, you could try brights, civil war prints, etc)
An embroidery needle with a larger eye for floss

Sewing machine and parts
Walking foot (if you have one)
Darning foot or free motion foot
