

BOOBAG

THIS BOOTIFUL BOOBAG IS A FUN WAY TO TREAT YOUR LITTLE MONSTERS OR NEIGHBORS THIS HALLOWEEN.

REQUIREMENTS:

Attic Window tool by Phillips Fiber Art

NOTIONS:

Strapping (optional, instructions for sewing a strap on page 4)

Movable eyes

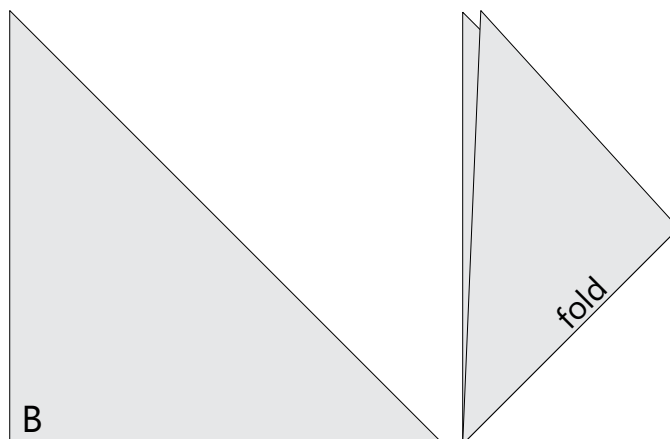
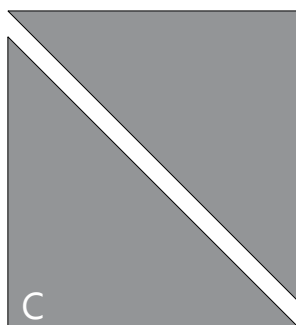
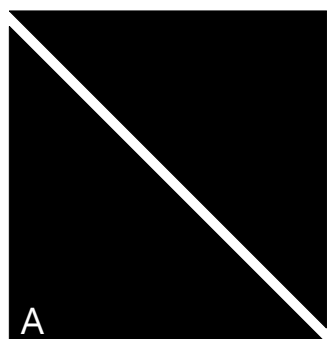
Yarns or pipe cleaners for accents

Fabric	Use	Suggested Yardage	Cutting
A	block background	fat quarter	6" square
B	folded insert	fat quarter	1 attic window triangle
C	corner triangles	fat quarter	two 5 ½" squares
D	bag back	leftover A, B, or C fabric	7" x 8"
E	lining	leftover A, B, or C fabric	8" x 14 ½"
F	handle	leftover A, B, or C fabric or strapping)	2 ½" x 22"
Batting		14"	7" x 14" 3" square

CUTTING

- Cut each fabric as shown in the yardage chart.
- Cut your A and C squares diagonally.

- Cut B fabric with the Attic Window tool using the 3 ½" line. (full tool)
- Fold in half right side out.



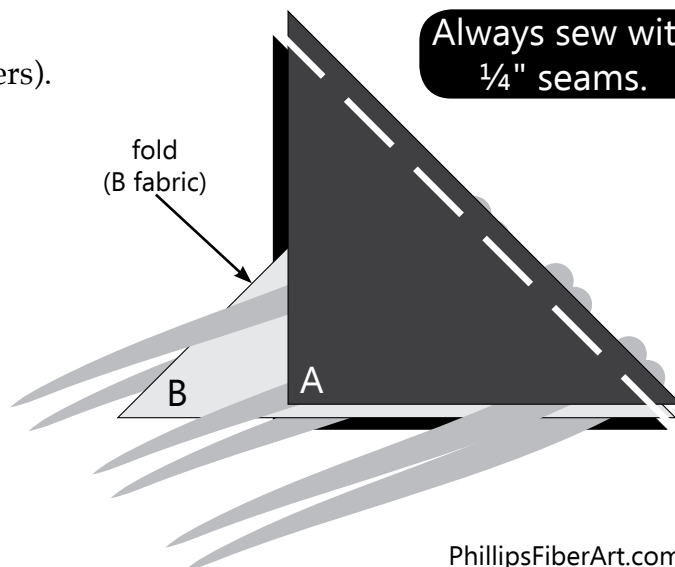
ASSEMBLY

- Layer your fabric and yarn accents (pipe cleaners).

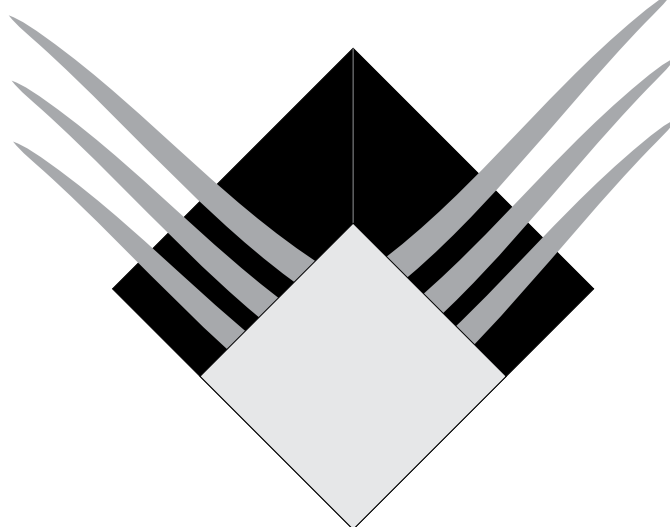
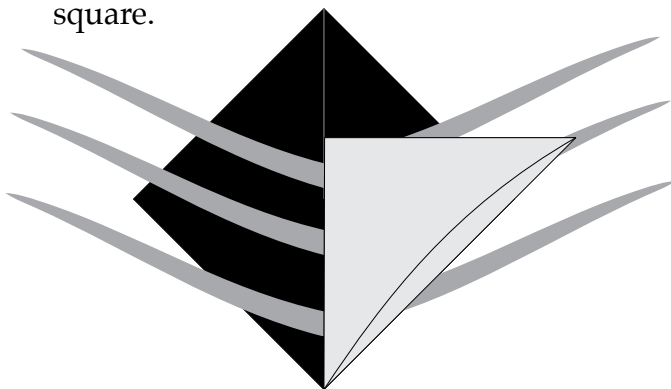
Δ Fabric A (right side up)
 ~ Yarn Accent
 Δ Fabric B (folded)
 ~ Yarn Accent
 Δ Fabric A (right side down)

- Sew using exact ¼" seams
- Iron Open your seams from the back.

When sewing over pipe cleaners hand crank to avoid breaking your needle.



- Open and iron the B Fabric to create a square.



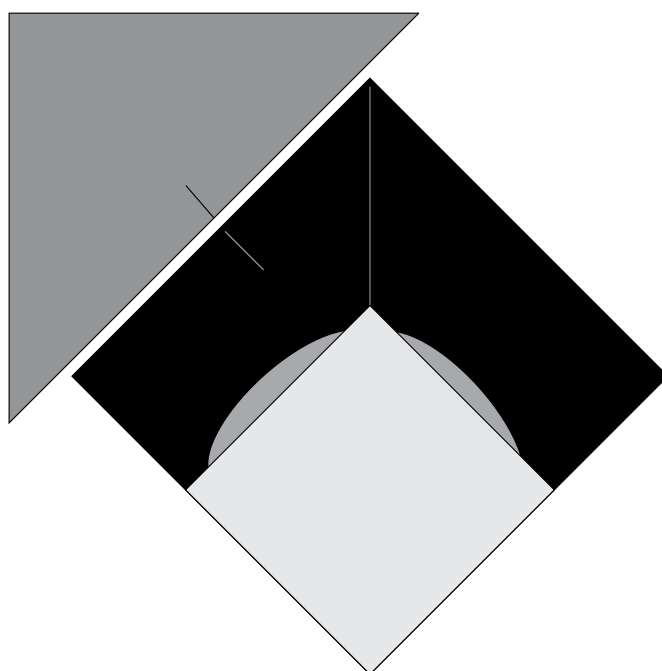
ADD CORNER TRIANGLES (C FABRIC)

- Finger press each center on each side of your Attic Window square.
- Finger press each C triangle. (as shown)
- Align centers (*your triangle will overlap the sides of the Attic Window square*).

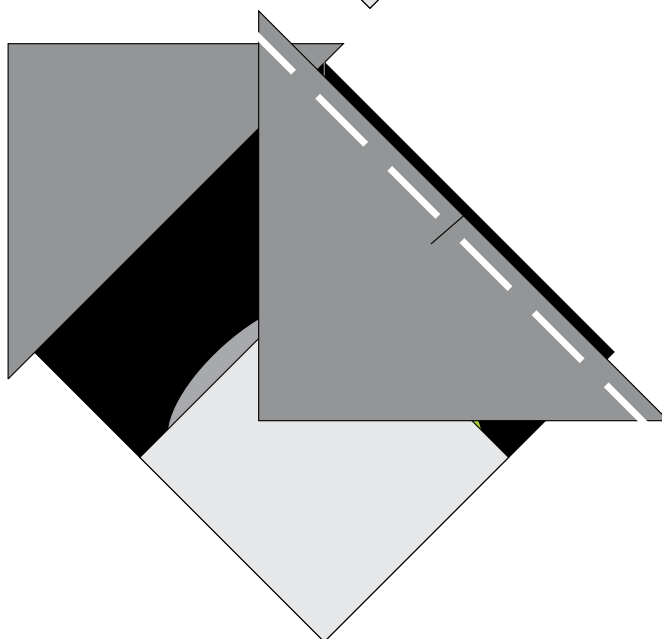
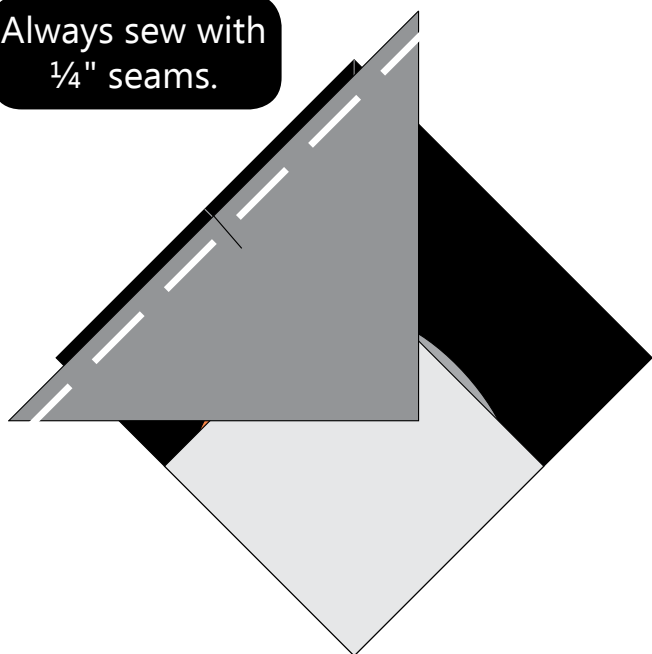
Hold yarn accent out of the way so you don't accidentally sew it into the corner triangles.

- Sew each triangle on, lightly finger press each one open before sewing on the next.

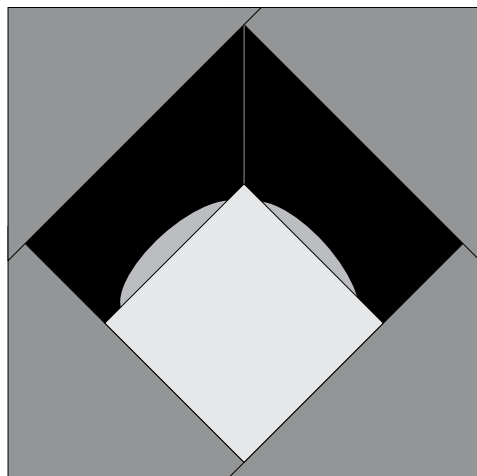
Before sewing final triangle on the pocket, gently insert the 3" square of batting into the pocket.



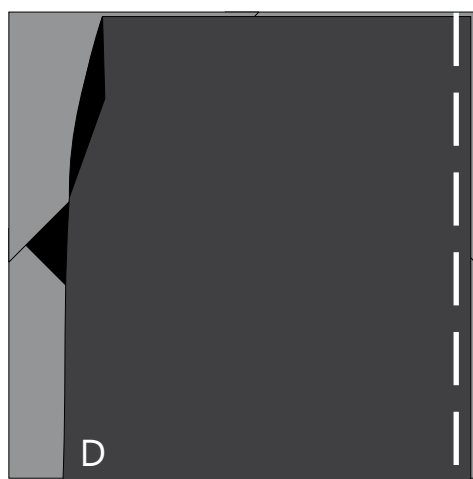
Always sew with
 $\frac{1}{4}$ " seams.



Once you sew your final triangle, tuck the yarn inside the pocket. It will be bulky so make sure you hold your triangle flat as you sew from now on.

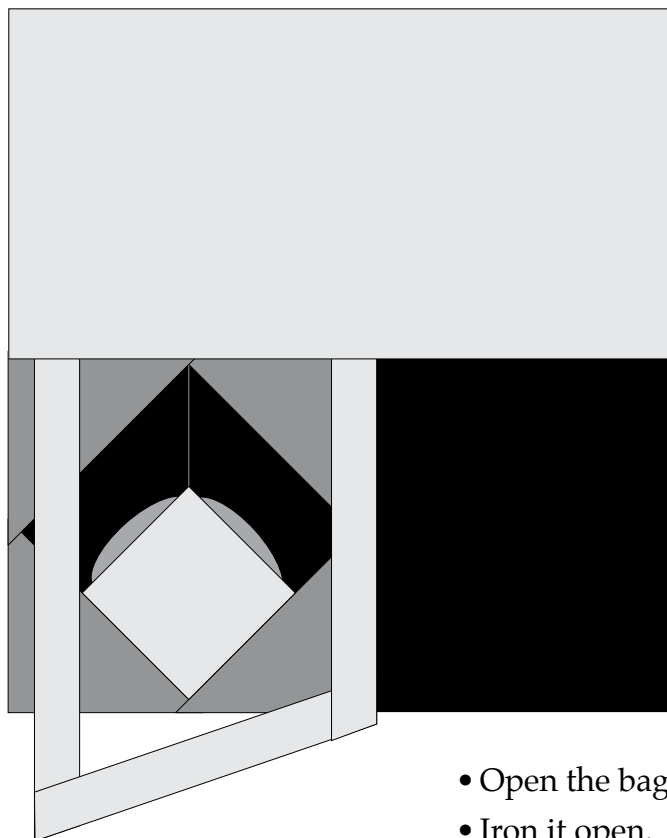
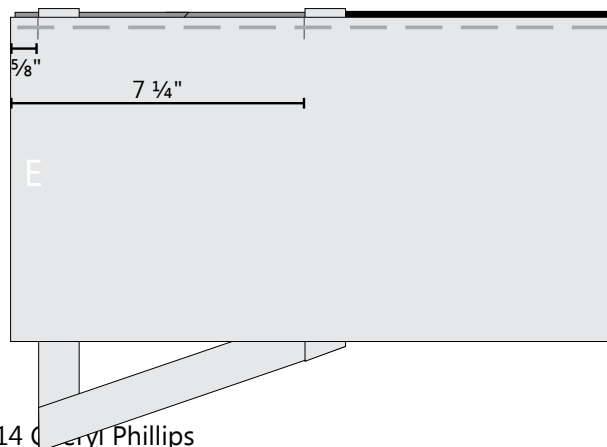
- Trim your edges to an 8" square.

**ADD BAG BACK (D FABRIC)**

- Sew D fabric (right sides together).

ADD LINING (E FABRIC)

- Mark E fabric $\frac{5}{8}$ " from left and $7\frac{1}{4}$ " from left. (top and bottom)
- Align strap to the right of those marks.
- Sew E fabric along the top edge (right sides together).



- Open the bag.
- Iron it open.

- Fold the bag (right sides together)

Watch out for the straps. Don't sew them into the side.

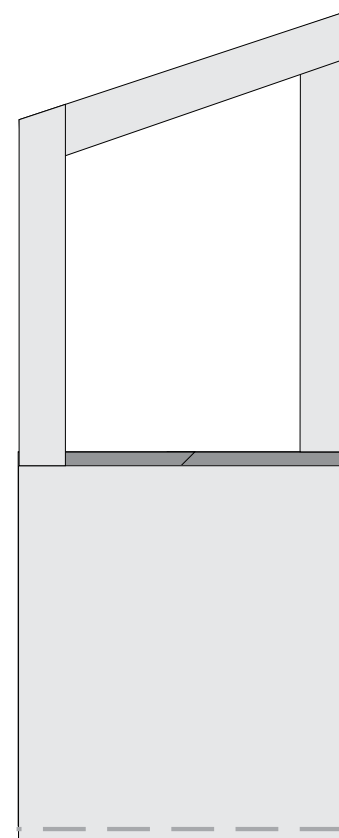
- Sew along the edge.



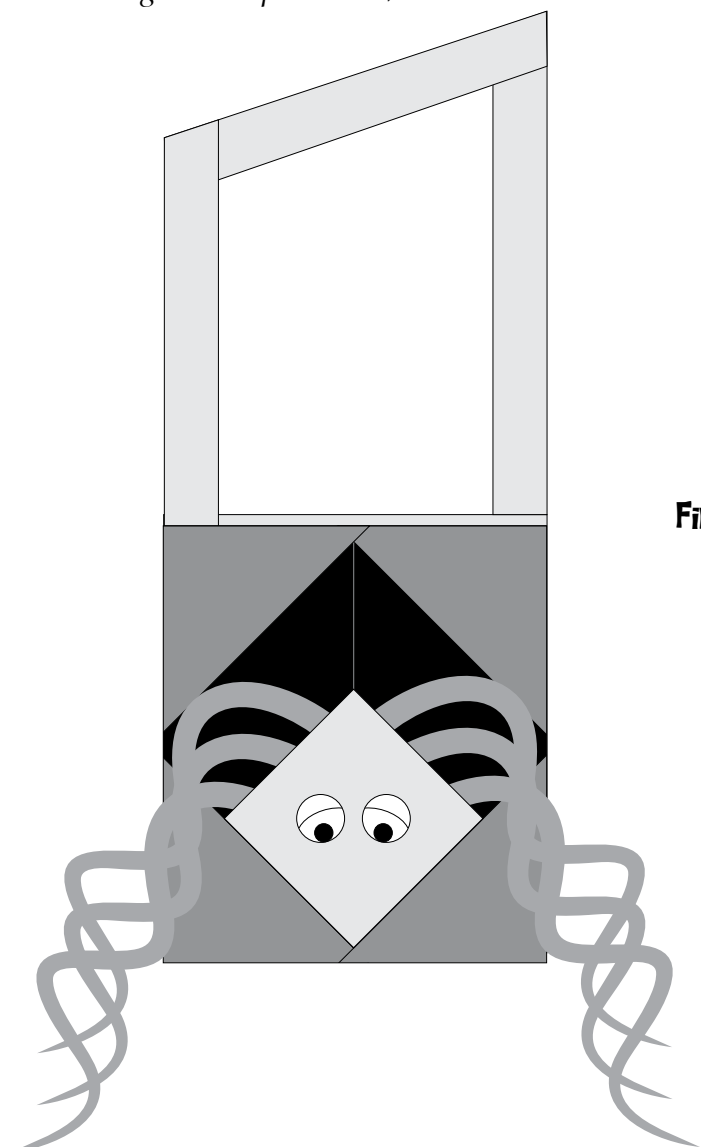
- Wrap the 7" x 14" piece of batting around the front section of the bag.
- Fold lining over the front and batting so the lining is on the outside of the bag.
- Align the bottom the Attic Window square is centered along the bottom of the bag.

The Attic Window square will wrap around to the back on each side. Your straps will fall one on each side (back and front).

- Sew along the bottom.
(Use a serger if you have one or add a tight zigzag stitch to the raw edges to keep it clean.)

FINAL TOUCHES

- Flip the back so the right side is on the outside.
- Pull the yarn accent out of the pocket.
- Add wiggly eyes to the pocket and any other accent you think would make it look bootiful!

HOW TO MAKE A STRAP (F FABRIC)

- Fold your F fabric right sides together.
- Sew along the raw edge.
- Flip so right sides are out.
- Iron flat.
- Top stitch 3 stitches along the length.
- Strap will be 1" x 22".
