

## Center Appliques

When you use the 10 Degree tool you'll have a large hole in the middle of your quilt. Here are some circles to applique over your center to finish it off.

1. Stabilize the center opening by ironing a **eight** inch square of freezer paper, waxy side down to the wrong side of the quilt top center.
2. Measure the diameter of the center opening. If it is larger than 5  $\frac{5}{8}$ " enlarge the template circle.
3. Trace the circle template onto the dull side of another piece of freezer paper.
4. Cut out the freezer paper pattern. Iron the waxy side to the wrong side of the center appliqué fabric.
5. Cut the applique fabric  $\frac{1}{4}$ " larger than the paper.
6. Using a fabric basting glue stick, apply glue to the edge of the paper.
7. Turn the extending fabric over and finger press down to the glued edge of the paper.
8. Place the appliqué over the center opening of the circle quilt and pin in place.
9. Appliqué by hand or machine.
10. Remove the paper from the fabric.
