The Basic version is a 54" square with borders. By turning the Basic on point and adding corners, the size increased to 72" square.

To make the Batik Beyond version, you'll make four of the triangle units shown above.

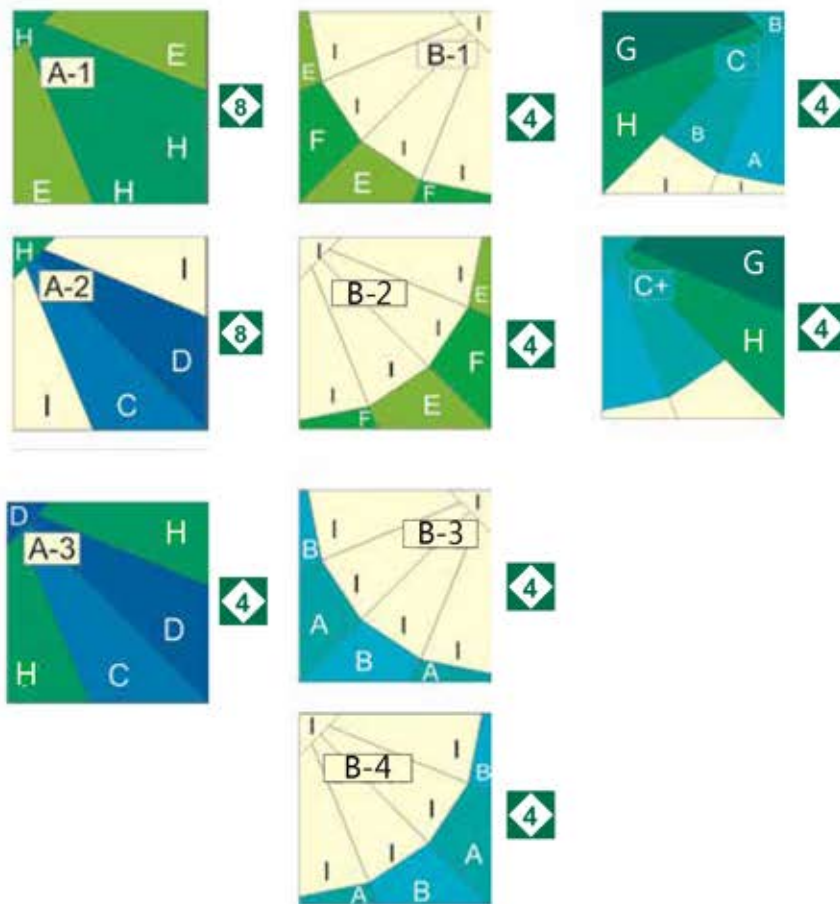
Cut the strips as shown in the chart. Fabrics which require additional strips to make the blocks are shown in bold lettering.

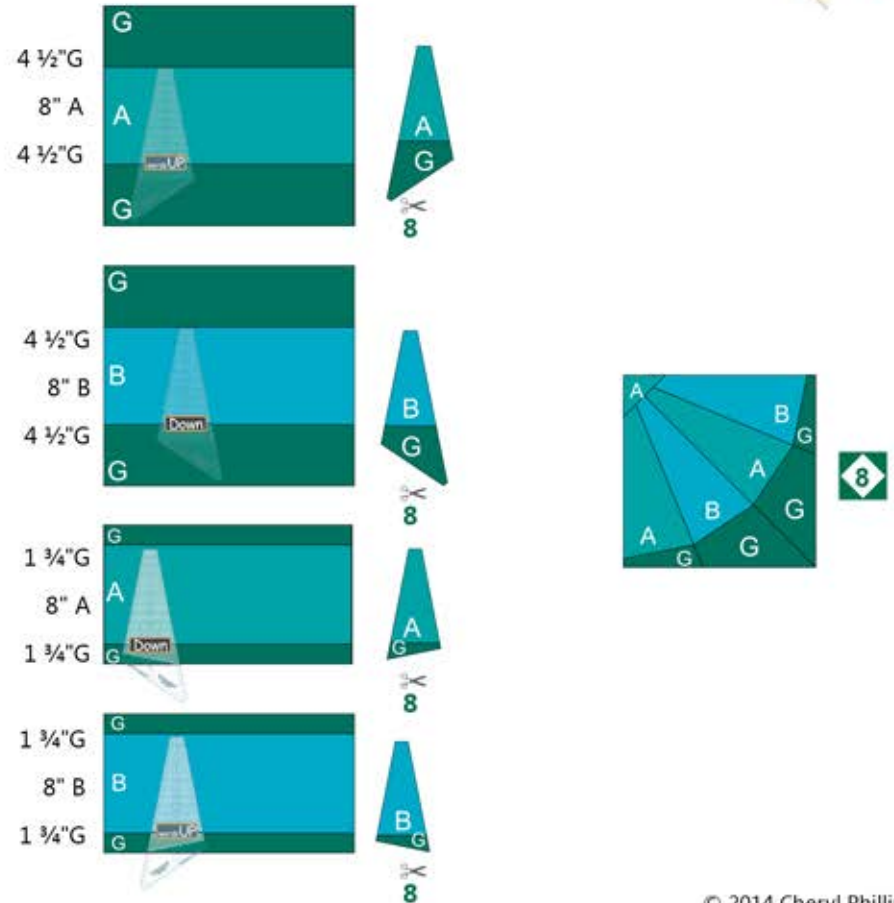
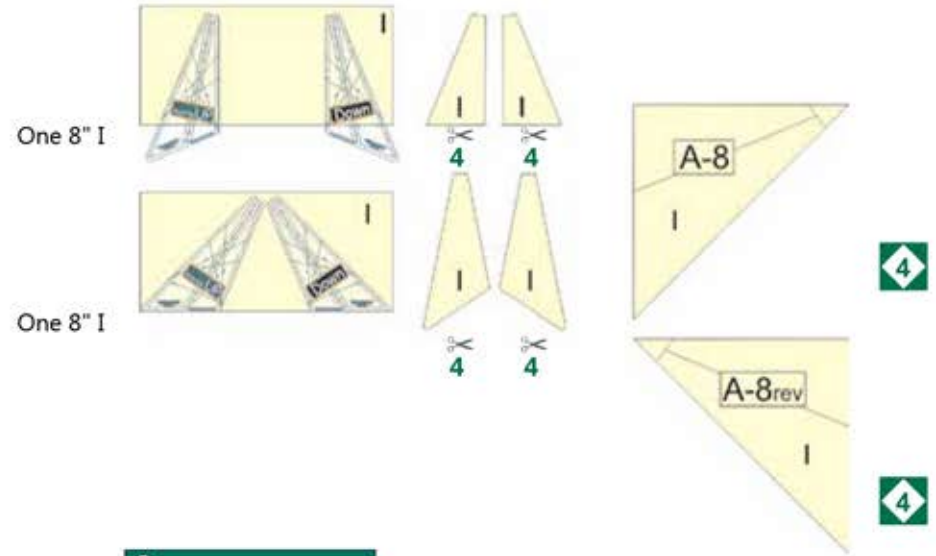
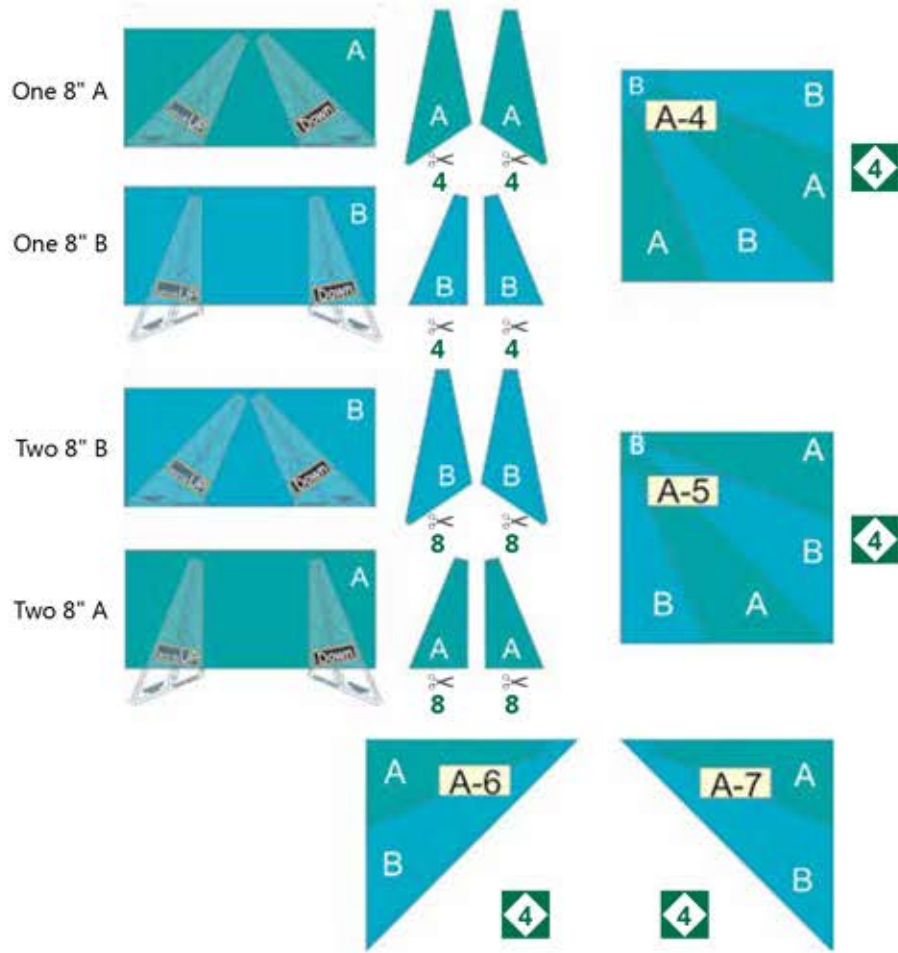


On this page are quads you find in your Basic Batik quilt:  
A-1, A-2, A-3, B-1, B-2, B-3, B-4, C, C+.

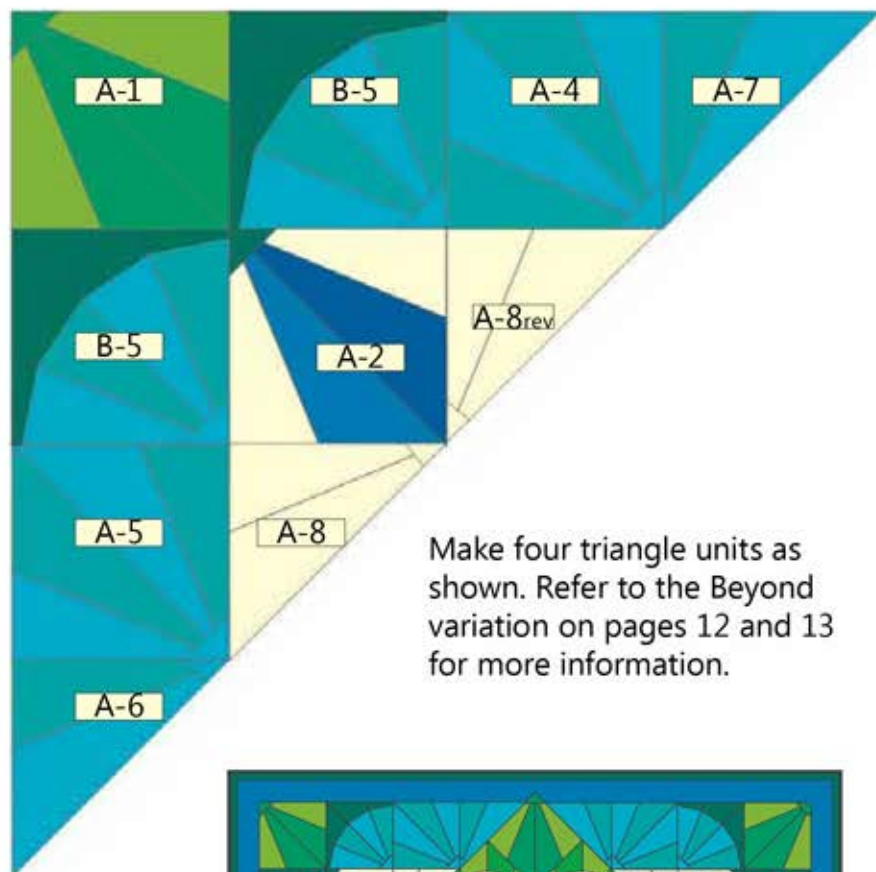
Make the exact same number of quads as you did in the Basic Quilt with the exception of A-1 and A-2. Make *eight* A-1 Quads and *eight* A-2 Quads.
