Notions, patterns and fabric should be new and quilted items should be in excellent condition and free of pet hair, dander, perfume, etc. The baskets should contain anything you would enjoy receiving if you “won” the basket. (like chocolate!)

To aid in the display, items need to be in some type of container, such as a tin, a box, a basket, etc. Submissions need to be wrapped in clear cellophane. Embellishments such as bows are good, but please attach a list of the contents along with an approximate value and who is providing the donation, which could be either a group or an individual. Quilts do not need to be wrapped.

Basic Sewing Kit (BSK) Information

Don't forget your **BSK** when you come to Quilt Fest. This can include hand needles, extra machine needles, pins, rotary cutter, mat, scissors, fabric markers, rulers, thread, extra bobbins, sewing machine, pedal, extension cord, machine power cord, books, light, pin cushion, seam ripper, feet, fabric, fusible, pressing sheet, pencil, marker, paper, glue stick, and smiles!

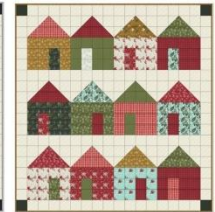

Description: The Nutcracker is a table mat/wall hanging project made of wool & silk velvet; and embellished with a variety threads such as Pearl Cotton, Trebizond Silk, Braided Metallic thread, Sue Spargo's Razzle and Dazzle, Hot Fix gold studs & crystals, and more. You will learn how to prep, applique, and embellish wool with a variety of embroidery stitches. We will talk about finishing with a backing and blanket stitch. The kit will include all wool, silk velvet, and hot fix items, and embellishment threads needed and a threader. You will need to bring a variety of your own needles which I will email a list to all participants. This class will be split into 2 classes with a day in between allowing time for the wool to be whip stitched onto the background before we go on to the embellishment class.

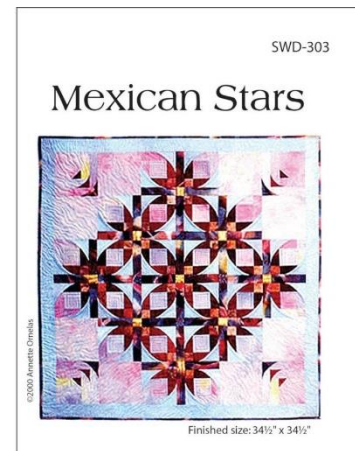

201 Flying Into Colors (part 1 and 2) Helen Godden

Part 1 - Thursday August 22 8:30-11:30am and 2:30-5:30 pm (all day) and

Part 2 Friday August 23 8:30-11:30 am and 2:30-5:30 pm (all day)

Introducing Helen's technique of *Paintchwork*....that is, painted not pieced patchwork working with stunning Metallic & Pearlescent Lumiere by Jacquard, acrylic fabric paints.

Day 1 - Students will chose from 20 designs for your own Flying Into Colours wall hanging 20 x 30". Helen will demonstrate how to trace & paint the design; how to combine colours and blend colours to create *Paintchwork* onto black fabric. Students will be blown away by the ease of painting with these fabric paints and their stunning results.



Day 2 - With Helen's expert guidance, booklet of Free-Motion designs and lots of demonstrating, students will enhance their piece with a wide variety of free-motion quilting styles to complement their work. Students will then paint again, this time into their free-motion stitching, enhancing and adding so much life and energy into their individual and unique work. This class is a lot of fun and very exciting as student's gain confidence in painting and in free-motion and their work comes to life in full colour!



202 Geese in the Cabin - Karin Crawford

Thursday Aug 22, 2024 8:30 - 11:30 and 2:30 - 5:30 (all day class)

Description: This is a very fun quilt to make. The blocks are put together in 6 different choices. The blocks are very precise as a special ruler from Creative Grids is used each step of the way. The finished quilt is 72 x 72 inches. This quilt was made at a retreat in Hamilton, Missouri and the entire group enjoyed making it. The pattern is from Cut Loose Press. The ruler is called 10" Log Cabin Trim Tool Duo. Both are needed for this class. Choose fabric that contrasts with the background fabric. Choose a very contrasting fabric for the geese (such as black or a dark maroon or green or whatever color goes with your accent fabric which will be the border.) Please come with your fabric starched and cut. Otherwise, it would take you most of the morning just cutting your strips. We will want to get sewing right away.

203 Legit Kits Little Hooter Becky Sanford

Description: Who? Who? Little Hooter, that's who! This wide-eyed and wise little bird is the latest in our wall hanging bird series. This kit contains color maps, fabric lists, an assembly guide, the full pattern printed on foundation paper, and clearly labeled, ample cuts of 75 different shades of Robert Kaufman Kona Cotton Solids to complete this medium sized, 30 inch wide by 40 inch long quilt top.

Description: This is a fall quilt. It is made with two blocks that are placed on the diagonal. There are two blocks in the quilt. A leaf block and a 16-patch block. There are half 16 patch blocks that are on the outside edge and because they are placed on the diagonal it gives an added bonus with the squares creating nice edge butting up to the inner border. 206 Pineapple Crowns - Machele Preston

207 Fat Quarter Waterproof Dopp Bag - Deborah Slechta

Description: Uneasy about sewing zippers? Never stitched on vinyl before? Making this Dopp Bag will give you the confidence to do so! What makes this Dopp Bag different than all the others is that it is waterproof. No more leaking bottles destroying the inside of your bag. Just a swipe will clean that opened bottle or uncapped toothpaste! As we are stitching, we can share travel stories or stitching disasters. You chose! The size of this Dopp Bag is 10 inches X 7 inches X 4 inches (approximately).





208 Sashiko: Japanese Folk-Art Embroidery - Shelley Koehler

A border can surround the interior blocks of a quilt bringing them to an abrupt halt or it can gently encourage those blocks to fill out the quilt and finish it. An exciting border can bring life to a plain quilt top, making the border the focal point of the quilt. This lecture will teach you how to figure out how to make your pieced borders the correct size to match your quilt top.

305 String Swap Day Quilt - Marsha Chappell

307 Diamond Chevron Quilt - Florence Evans

Class Description Transform your 2 ½" strips into a sparkling mix of diamonds in a chevron setting. Partly strip-pieced, this quilt goes together more quickly and easily than you would expect. Whether you work from a coordinated collection of 2 ½" strips, two color families, or a riotous mix of scraps, the resulting quilt will be something fabulous!

The finished size of the quilt is 36" x 54". With one optional border (4" wide), the finished size would be 44" x 62". With two optional borders (one at 1" wide and one at 6" wide), the finished sized would be 50" x 68". The quilt may also be made larger by adding more rows and/or columns.



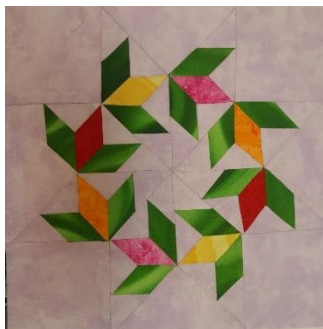


308 Fit to be Dyed! Trunk Show and Demo - Ruth Davis
