Born in England, Dr. Judy Elsley has most recently been a professor in the English Department at Weber State University until 2016. Quilting has been the subject of many of Judy's published articles.

Judy will tell how she coped with her journey through breast cancer through quilting. She will show the quilts made during this journey. Her artistic quilts made through this time of her life fell into three categories:

- 1. What the Body Knew: She made these quilts before her diagnosis. Her body was trying to tell her what was happening although she didn't yet know it.
- 2. Journal Quilts: She made and wrote on one 8"x8" square every day for 360 days, almost one year. Each of the 9 journal quilts is composed of 40 squares, a reference to the Biblical 40 days and 40 nights in the wilderness.
- 3. Breast Cancer Quilts: These quilts address some of the issues and concerns she faced as she went through the experience.

- Step 4 Click "Group Table Reservation."
- Step 5 For each person, you must enter first and last name, email address, any Special meals (diabetic, gluten free, vegetarian, food allergy) and lunch day(s).
- Step 6 Click "Submit."
- Step 7 Check your email for confirmation.

For a group larger than 6:

- Step 1 Buy your lecture luncheon ticket!
- Step 2 Gather information from your quilty friends. Be sure you know which day(s) they bought a lecture luncheon ticket.

Some things to remember:

The deadline for making group table reservations will be Sunday, September 5, 2021 at 10 pm.

- All reservations are contingent on payment being received by September 6, 2021.
- Confirmations will be sent out via email on Sunday, September 12, 2021.
- Each person in the group will receive his/her own email confirmation.
- Tickets purchased after September 5th are for the standard meal. No special requests (D, G, V, A)!

Q&A's

- Q: Do I need to make a reservation for one person?
 - A: YES! Unless you are happy sitting in the back every single day.
- Q: I bought my lecture luncheon ticket after September 5th. Will I have an assigned table?
 - A: Yes, but it will be in the back of the room.
- Q: I made a reservation, but forgot to buy a ticket before September 5th. Will I still be able to sit with my group?
 - A: Probably not.
- Q: I have a guest I want to bring to the luncheon. What do I do?
 - A: First, buy your lecture luncheon tickets—one for you and one for your guest. Then, follow steps to make a group reservation.
- Q: Will I have a good seat if I reserve early?
 - A: Not necessarily. Everyone is moved around the room throughout Quilt Fest. One day you could be up front, the next day you could be in the back. We try our best to let everyone who makes a reservation have a turn at the "prime" seats.
- Q: I have special medical needs and must sit on the side/front/middle. What do I do?
 - A: After making group reservation, send an email to QuiltFestLunches@gmail.com with specific needs.
- Q: Who do I contact with questions about luncheon reservations?



Use all or part of it to make a quilt that Alice would sew in QuiltLand. Be sure to register your quilt for the Quilt Show at Quilt Fest. Minimum size is 40" perimeter, there is no maximum . Include a sleeve and label. Three viewer's choice awards will be given on Saturday. Do not violate copyright.

to "Discover the Artist Within." Find a painting or a piece of art work and recreate it with fabric. Annette was especially inspired when she attended the UQSM show and saw the quilts that were made representing Van Gogh's work. Another idea for inspiration is to make an original quilt using the style of a favorite quilt artist. Be sure to register your quilt (see Challenge entry form on page 13). Minimum size is 80" perimeter, and no larger than 144". Include a sleeve and label. The cost is \$5 to participate. Three viewer's choice awards will be given on Saturday. Do not violate copyright.

The <u>Full Deck Challenge</u>, completed last year, will also be on display this year at Quilt Fest. The quilts are still viewable on the website under the "gallery" section. These are the same quilts that were on display at Nuttall's this past fall, and have been traveling around to various shows this spring. This will be a great chance to see these fun quilts in person!

This "Challenge" is closed, so no new quilts will be accepted for this Quilt Fest as a part of this challenge. However, if this challenge inspired ideas, you can always enter quilts into either the <u>Alice in QuiltLand challenge</u> (make sure to include some of the challenge fabric) or the <u>Artist Within Challenge</u>.



Jean Christensen Founders Award for the Best Hand Quilting

In 2014 Wilford Christensen gifted the Utah Quilt Guild with a generous fund to be used to encourage the art and traditions of hand quilting. The award was made in his wife, Jean's, name. Their legacy continues. We honor them both by continuing to instruct, award and encourage hand quilting.

OPPORTUNITY QUILT II

Jean Christensen was one of the Utah Quilt Guild's founding members and was the Guild's 1st President. She collected many antique quilts during her travels and donated them to This Is The Place State Park. This year's opportunity quilt is a replica of one of the quilts in the Jean Christensen Quilt Collection that is housed at the Deseret Hospital at This Is the Place State Park. The original quilt was called Kansas Sunflower by an unknown quiltmaker and dates from the 19th century from 1840-1860. It is thought to have possibly originated from Bucks County, Pennsylvania. The replica measures $67 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $85 \frac{1}{2}$ ". It has the same coloration to the fabrics; but a mid-green binding was added, while the origi-



nal has a white binding. The background is white grunge fabric with a green tint. The quilting is somewhat different from the original with an original quilting pattern in



the border based on the appliqué motifs used in the quilt and it is quilted in slightly contrasting thread to make it stand out a bit more. The handappliqué and hand-quilting were done by Annette Bracken. She used 100% cotton fabrics with an 80/20 cotton batting.

Quilt Fest Baskets & Auction

The baskets provided are usually the efforts of many in each UQG chapter so that no one member bears the whole cost. However, in the time of Covid, many groups are not in face-to-face meetings. While that may make it more difficult to organize, please consider making a donation. Some groups will opt for the usual "basket" while others might donate a quilt. This year's theme is "Discover the Artist Within," and doesn't that theme open up the possibilities! In your welcoming packet you will have a ballot to vote for your favorite basket. Prizes of \$75, \$50, and \$25 will be awarded to the three favorite baskets.



DONATE **AUCTION ITEMS**

Here are the basic guidelines: Donations can be quilting related items, fabrics, notions, household items... maybe even a quilt! They should be in excellent condition and free of pet hair, dander and perfume... really about anything you would like to receive if you won the basket. For display, items need to be in some type of container...a tin, box,

basket etc. Submissions need to be wrapped in clear cellophane. Embellishments such as bows are good but please attach a list of the contents, an approximate value and who made the donation either group or individual. Quilts do not need to be wrapped.







Class Description - Birdsville by Wendy Williams is a wall hanging that has it all: machine piecing, wool appliqué, machine appliqué cotton appliqué, hand embroidery, special binding technique and embellishment with metallic threads. When completed and hanging on your wall, it will be a showstopper.

Class Supply List - You will come to class with your background already pieced and ready to go with the appliqués. Your wool will be selected and prepared with Soft Fuse before class. Freezer paper, scissors (paper and embroidery), wool thread to match your tree trunk and the other wool selected for the birds, flowers and leaves, #8 perle cotton for thread embellishment (hand embroidery). Fons and Porter Glue stick, Glue Baste-it.

Pre-Class Preparation - You will be required to download the Wendy Williams pattern from Quiltmania Magazine #113. This pattern is probably about \$9.00. You must do this to follow the pattern in order to assemble the background which must be already made at home. We start the class by adding the tree trunk and going from there.

Extended Supply List - Birdsville: Supply list - Please read through entire list before you begin!

Pattern: The most affordable way to obtain this pattern by Wendy Williams is to go to the website Quiltmania.com. Birdsville is on the cover of Issue No. 113. The entire pattern, including photos and instructions, is located inside this issue. The cost is \$9.50 for the eMagazine. In other words, you must download it onto your own computer and print out the pattern. You must then tape the 6 pattern pieces together and take it to a printer and enlarge it by 111%. The only other option is to purchase a hardcopy pattern from Wendy Williams' website: Flying Fish and the cost is \$22.00 plus \$7.00 shipping to the US from Australia for a total of \$29.00. You must obtain the pattern early because of the requirement of preparing the background and having it ready BEFORE class begins.

Background: Use an assortment of 4 grey and 4 beige fabrics for the two-toned background. Fabric selection should be very close in contrast. This fabric is meant to fade into the background. Each of the 8 fabrics should be cut 6 inches by WOF. In addition you will also need 1 fat quarter of one of the beige fabrics and 1 fat quarter of one of the grey fabrics. Please starch all fabric before subcutting. When I starch, I use StaFlo from Wal-Mart and soak the fabric in a 50/50 mixture of starch and water. I air dry the fabric and iron it with steam. This takes care of any bleeding and/or shrinking. We are working with biases and this helps to stabilize the background fabric. Place two WOF fabric strips (right sides together) and subcut into 5 ½ inch squares. You will get 7 sets out of two WOF strips. Cut one 5½ inch square from each fat qtr. On the wrong side of the darker fabric mark a diagonal cutting line from corner to corner. Then sew a ¼ inch seam from that line on each side of it. Cut on the marked line, open the 2 half square triangles, iron the seam to the darker side, and you have 2 two-toned squares. Square up each one to 4 ½ inches with seam allowance included. You need a total of 57 two-toned 4 ½ inch squares. Follow the pattern to sew together these two-toned squares correctly. You will have a few left over two-toned squares. I used my leftovers for the label background. Also needed is one beige linen piece 7/8 yard. After starching, drying, and ironing with steam, cut the linen exactly 28.5 by 36.5 inches. The two-toned squares will be added to the beige linen piece, following the pattern. Completed background will measure 40 by 48 inches.

Trees: Grey wool for the tree and branches. You need a piece 5 by 40 inches. Please stabilize this wool on the back with a piece of Softfuse cut 5 by 40 inches. Leave the paper on the back until you are ready to fuse it onto the background. Please come to class with this wool already cut into three long pieces of 1 by 40 inches and the rest cut into ½ inch wide strips for the branches. Do not subcut yet. We will be putting the tree and branches down onto the background the very first thing in class.

Flowers: From your fabric stash, select cotton fabric with large flowers for the centers of the large tree flowers. Think bright like Kaffe Fassett fabric. You will be fussy cutting the centers to be appliquéd onto the wool circles for the tree. You will need enough for 32 large tree flowers and 8 small flowers for the foreground. Any prep work you can do on these flowers will be very helpful.

BIRDS and FLOWERS: Assortment of 15 to 20 wool pieces for birds and flowers. Bright colors work best: no muted colors. 6 by 10 inches are needed for each color. I might suggest: Red, orange, burnt orange, bright yellow, gold, turquoise, sky blue, royal blue, purple, lavender, raspberry, fuchsia, bright pink, lime green, medium green, emerald green. There is a greater use of orange in this quilt so bring plenty of that color if you wish. PLEASE stabilize all the wool with Softfuse.

Leaves:16 by 40 inches of medium green stabilized with Softfuse Five bright colors for the leaf wool appliqués:10 by 10 inches each color (lime green, orange, raspberry, purple, bright yellow.) Please stabilize with Softfuse.

Embellishment: #8 and #12 perle cotton and Chenille needles #24.I use a lot as I thread up all the colors to be able to switch back and forth. I also use Sue Spargo's cotton Eleganza and wool Ellana thread. Start collecting the colors to match your wool. Bring a pincushion for all of your threaded chenille needles. We will be doing a lot of hand stitching in the second day class session.

Supplies: Fons and Porter glue stick, paper scissors, embroidery scissors, wool scissors (Karen Kaye Buckley's blue handled) appliqué thread to match your flower fabric, appliqué needles, freezer paper, water soluble marker, perfect circle templates, starch if you like to use it for the fabric circles, twenty 1/8 inch buttons in brown or black for the eyes of the birds. (Handmaiden in Sandy)

A small table runner or wall quilt project that allows you to practice those techniques will take you where you want to go. In class you will create 2 segments of Bargello which can be rotated several different ways for striking results. For a longer table runner or larger wall hanging, more segments can be easily added.

Class Supply List - 1/4 yard of 9 different fabrics. Make sure that there is color and value separation between each fabric. If you are concerned about your choices bring your fabric to class before cutting. You will need two width of fabric 2 1/2" strips cut from each of the 9 fabrics. A jelly roll will work as long as there is enough color difference between each of the fabrics. Choose fabrics that read as solids. Large and busy prints do not work well. Glue stick and paper.







Class Description - You will learn to make a quick set of triangles and then put together a quilt that gives the effect of water rippling over pebbles in a creek. The effect is stunning and all consuming as you watch the magic unfold. This pattern lends itself very well to those large bold prints such as florals or Kaffee Fassett's, or other collections that you purchase because you love them but which often sit unused as they can be hard to put together. You may want to choose a theme to express in your fabrics such as fire, a walk along the beach, autumn, or gardening. Batiks and solid fabrics can be stunning too. The trick to the shimmer is in using correct value & color separation between the bold prints and correct placement of the half-square triangle blocks. This pattern was created by Jenny Bowker from Australia. I may not have her cute accent but I have her permission to teach this class. Since time is limited we will only work on a small portion of the quilt but each student will understand how to make the triangle blocks with the correct placement and value separation to continue their shimmer at home.

Class Supply List - 1/4 to 1/3 yard of 5 different feature fabrics. (Fat quarters may work unless you are fussy cutting specific motifs) Choose one main feature fabric and then choose 4 other fabrics that will contrast with it. They can all be big prints, but they must have good color and value separation. Cut one 8 ½ x 4 ½ inch rectangle. Cut two 6 ½ x 6 ½ inch squares from each border print. These can be all be from the same fabric or multiple different fabrics. **Corner posts:** Cut one 4 ½ x 4 ½ inch piece and one 6 ½ x 6 ½ inch piece of the same fabric. Each corner can be from the same fabric or each different. Bring extra fabrics to class to audition. For help with fabric selections check out Shimmering Triangles on Pinterest or Facebook. 

Deliver your quilt(s) to selected shops before September 4, 2021 (Shops will be identified in the July and August Beeline) or you can mail or deliver your quilts between August 30 and September 8 to Louise Mudd, 1102 E., 2550 N., Layton, UT 84040. If you are delivering in person, please call first to make sure Louise is at home. Call Louise at 385-445-8500.

Remember, the show will end on Saturday September 18, 2021. You may pick up your quilt after approximately 3:30 pm, at the lobby entrance to the Expo room. Please bring identification with you to pick up your quilt.

HOW TO MAKE A

SLEEVE

- Cut a strip of fabric 9" wide by the width of your quilt.
- 2. On the short side, turn a double 1/4" seam and stitch down the sides to prevent fraying.
- 3. Fold in half lengthwise (right sides together) and sew a ¼" seam along the non-folded edge.
 - 4. Turn sleeve right-side out.
- 5. Center the sleeve on the top back of the quilt. The sleeve's side edges should fall
- just inside the quilt binding. Place sleeve between 1/4" to 3/4" from the top of the
- quilt. If your quilt has a scalloped edge,
- please be aware that the scalloped edge may flop down if the sleeve is attached
- too low on the back. Blind stitch sleeve to the quilt back along the top and bottom
- edges. If this quilt is for display only, the sleeve may be pinned onto the back of the quilt.
- 6. Don't forget to label your quilt. Include your name, the title of the quilt. If you want you can add a story and date for

Utah Quilt Guild Quilt Show Rules 2021 Discover the Artist Within

A quilt is defined as having three distinct layers – a top, middle, and backing. Quilting stitches must penetrate all three layers and be visible on the back. Quilt edge must be finished with some sort of binding or facing.

This year there are four classes for the adult portion of the competition.

Challenger (Solo Artist) – Someone who quilts primarily as a hobby. This can include someone who does a lot of charity work. This also includes anyone that has not previously won a first or second place award at a prior Quilt Fest, Springville, or nationally recognized show (such as Utah Quilting and Sewing Marketplace, UQSM, formerly HMQS). State fair or county fair awards are allowed.

Challenger (Joint Artist) – Someone who quilts primarily as a hobby. This can include someone who does a lot of charity work. This also includes anyone that has not previously won a first or second place award at a prior Quilt Fest, Springville, or nationally recognized show (such as Utah Quilting and Sewing Marketplace, UQSM, formerly HMQS). State fair or county fair awards are allowed. This quilt top is prepared by the submitting artist, and was quilted by someone else. Quilt top maker may have significant input into how the top is quilted.

Champion (Solo Artist) – Someone who has previously won a first or second place award at Quilt Fest, or a nationally recognized show. This category also includes anyone who is a professional in the quilting industry. Professionals include those who quilt for hire, develop and sell patterns, teach classes, professional quilting show judges, etc.

Champion (Joint Artist) – Someone who has previously won a first or second place award at Quilt Fest, or a nationally recognized show. This category also includes anyone who is a professional in the quilting industry. Professionals include those who quilt for hire, develop and sell patterns, teach classes, professional quilting show judges, etc. This quilt top is prepared by the submitting artist, and was quilted by someone else.

Quilt top maker may have significant input into how the top is quilted.

Please select the best category for your quilt entry. You must select a single category for each quilt you enter. Each person is only allowed to enter **one** quilt in each category. Therefore, if you are entering two quilts, they must be in two different categories. Entrants are responsible for choosing the best category, however, the Utah Quilt Guild (UQG) Quilt Show committee and judges reserves the right to change the category of the quilt if deemed necessary for any reason. The UQG show committee reserves the right to eliminate any category if the number of entrants in the category is less than 5. Quilts submitted into an eliminated category will be moved to a different category.

Entry category Definitions: Ribbons and monetary prizes to be awarded in each category listed below:

Pieced (Challenger Solo/Joint and Champion Solo/Joint): Pieced construction <u>predominates</u> with a perimeter of at least 120" Minimal appliqué or other embellishments are allowed.

Appliqué (Challenger Solo/Joint and Champion Solo/Joint): Appliqué <u>predominates</u> construction with a perimeter of at least 120". Some piecing and minimal other allowed embellishments are allowed.

Small wall hanging (Challenger Solo/Joint and Champion Solo/Joint): Any technique, with a perimeter less than 120". May be considered a "miniature" quilt or may be a small art type or mixed technique quilt.

Mixed/Special Technique (Challenger Solo/ Joint and Champion Solo/Joint): A quilt where a fairly even amount of multiple techniques are used to develop a design of the top. An example (but not limited to) would be a quilt with appliqué and piecing where neither technique dominates. Or a quilt where embroidery, cross-stich, etc. are used. Many times this has at least 3 techniques or lots of special embellishments (such as crystals). Typically this is a more "traditional" quilt, and the quilt does not otherwise fit into the Art Quilt category. Perimeter is at least 120".

Art/Innovative Quilt (Challenger Solo and Champion Solo): An ORIGINAL work of visual fiber art. Quilt will be judged on artistic merit, design and detailed quilting. Addition of beads, buttons or

other objects will be acceptable providing they are securely attached, and the quilt may be hung with minimal care. Only Solo Artist submissions will be accepted in this category. There are no size constraints in this category.

Modern (Challenger Solo/Joint and Champion Solo/Joint): Quilt may feature high contrasting colors, minimalism, improvisational piecing, expansive negative space and/or non-traditional layouts. Perimeter is at least 120".

Group Quilt: A quilt that involves three or more persons in its completion. Involves all techniques as well as quilting by a person other than the makers of the top. Note – this category only has one award level.

Youth up to age 15: Must be 15 and under as of 9/18/2021. Quilt may be quilted by someone other than the quilt top maker.

Youth 16-18: Must be age16-18 as of 9/18/2021. Quilt may be quilted by someone other than the quilt top maker.

In addition to the categories above, ribbons and monetary awards will be provided for the following. If a quilt is selected as a "Best of" winner, it will not receive an award from the originating category.

Best of Show: Quilt judges deem as Best of Show

Jean Christensen Founders Award for Hand Quilting: Quilt judges deem as best hand quilting

Best Solo Artist Challenger: Quilt judges deem as Best solo artist by a Challenger

Best Solo Artist Champion: Quilt judges deem as Best solo artist by a Champion

Best Joint Artist Challenger: Quilt judges deem as Best joint artist by a Champion

Best Joint Artist Champion: Quilt judges deem as Best joint artist by a Challenger

Patsy Shelton Award: Quilt selected by friends of Patsy that best reflects Patsy's love of purple, flowers, and embellishments. This award may be selected from Display Only quilts as well as competition quilts. There are no size constraints in this category.

Viewers Choice: Quilt that has the most votes from the quilt show attendees

In addition, to the awards above, Ribbon only awards will be provided for the following catego-

ries.

Judge's Choice: Personal favorite of the judges. Each judge selects one quilt.

National Teacher's Choice: Personal favorite of the National Teacher. Each National Teacher selects one quilt.

A quilt maker may submit up to two quilts for competition. The quilts must not be submitted for judging in the same category. If more that one entry is received for the same category, the second quilt may be moved to an exhibit only category, and the fee forfeited.

Quilts must have been completed in the last three years and be clean.

No tied or Tricot quilts will be accepted for judging. They can be submitted for Exhibit only.

Please give credit where credit is due. You will be asked to provide your design source (pattern, magazine, workshop, or original design, for example). All persons involved in the making of the quilt must be listed in the appropriate sections of the registration form, including who constructed the quilt and who quilted the quilt. A group of three or more quilters involved in the making of the quilt should be registered in the group category, this includes the top makers and the quilter(s).

Entries without sleeves will not be displayed. If the quilt is submitted without a sleeve, the entry fee will be forfeited.

There will be a \$10 charge for each entry for UQG members, limit of two competition entries per person. Quilts for display only will be \$5 per entry. Youth entries will be \$5 per entry. The fee for non-UQG members will be \$15 per entry. Please note, it is up to the individual to insure their quilts, the show does not insure the quilts.

Place each entry in a <u>separate</u> disposable bag (paper or plastic). Your name and the name of the quilt must be identified on the bag. (Stapled paper copy of entry form is allowed, use a separate piece of paper to identify your name and the name of the quilt)

Each quilt <u>must</u> have a fabric label on the back of the quilt stating your name and the title of the quilt.

Each quilt must have its own entry form.

Only the person designated to pick up the quilt listed on the entry form

and the quilt owner will be allowed to pick up the quilt after the show on Saturday September 18, 2021. Pick up will begin at approximately 3:30pm at the lobby door to the Expo room. For security purposes, only the assigned quilt show volunteers will take down the quilts and distribute them.

Entry Paperwork: All entry paperwork and a photograph of the quilt must reach the Quilt Show Coordinator by midnight August 15, 2021. The easiest way to enter is online at www.utahquiltguild.org. A picture of your entry will need to be uploaded, so have it ready when you begin the entry process.

- 1. Log onto the site and then click the quilt show link on the first page of the website. The entry form will pop up.
- 2. Fill out the form, upload your picture, type in your quilt story and click "submit". Your quilt will be entered in the show. You will receive an e-mail receipt. If you don't, please email Louise so she can confirm that your entry was completed. Be sure to follow the directions to pay by Credit Card, or you may mail your check, made out to the Utah Quilt Guild to: Louise Mudd, 1102 E. 2550 N., Layton, UT 84040. If you are not prompted to upload a picture, please email the picture to Louise at louisemudd@yahoo.com or text it to 385-445-8500. Please tell Louise your name if you are emailing or texting a picture.
- 3. We are aware that the website is finicky. If you have trouble entering your quilt online, you are not alone. You can contact Louise to finish the entry process if it acts up. We can accept texts of the pictures of the quilt if needed. If you don't get a receipt, contact Louise and she can tell you if your entry was completed. You may need to take a picture of your entry form and submit that or submit via regular mail. If it's close to the deadline, please make sure you email or somehow convey your information and intent to Louise so you are submitted prior to the deadline.

Entry Drop off Instructions: Quilts must reach Louise Mudd between August 30 and September 8, 2021. We will identify local quilt shops that will be accepting quilts for the quilt show in the

July and August Beelines. If you need additional help, contact your UQG Area Representative. Contact information is in the Beeline and online at utahquiltguild.org. Your Area Representative may be able to help deliver your entry. Please make arrangements ahead of the deadline with her. You may also mail your quilt to: Louise Mudd 1102 E. 2550 N., Layton, UT 84040. Please tell Louise, via email or text, if you are mailing the quilt to her.

Awards presentation: The awards will be presented on Tuesday at dinner. The show will open Wednesday morning. Viewers Choice will be awarded at the Saturday luncheon.

Entry pick-up: The quilt show will end at 2:00 pm on Saturday, September 18, 2021. You may pick up your quilt after approximately 3:30 pm at the lobby door to the Expo room. To prove ownership, please have identification or your entry form


