

Anne brought in her Deer in the Attic Window quilt. This is her "I have the fabric for that" challenge for June.








Julie made a beautiful Lone Stare Quilt, custom quilted by Jillyn.

Also, Jackie picked up this blue quilt she made, quilted by Judy with Clouds.





Split Back Star Block

Use white fabric for the stars, and use h


Use white fabric for the stars, and use blues and reds that "read as solids".

Leave your completed 12 ½" x 12 ½" blocks at Aunt Judy's Attic.

Blocks will be made into quilts for the Grant County veterans by the Southwest Valor Quilters.

Helpful tip:

when sewing the star points, sew a scant seam on the side of the diagonal line that will be cut off.



Cutting from yardage to make 8 Split Back Star Blocks at a time - *wof = width of fabric Cut from Red fabric: 1 strip measuring 5" x wof; 3 strips measuring 4 ½" x wof Cut from Blue fabric: 1 strip measuring 5" x wof; 3 strips measuring 4 ½" x wof. Cut from White fabric: 1 strip measuring 4 ½" x wof; 4 strips measuring 2 ½" x wof
