

She also learned to draw paper-pieced soccer balls and made this quilt for a friend.





Split Back Star Block

Click here to download the pattern.


Use white fabric for the stars, and use blues and reds that "read as solids".

Leave your completed 12 ½" x 12 ½" blocks at Aunt Judy's Attic.

Blocks will be made into quilts for the Grant County veterans by the Southwest Valor Quilters.

Helpful tip:

when sewing the star points, sew a scant seam on the side of the diagonal line that will be cut off.



Cutting from yardage to make 8 Split Back Star Blocks at a time - *wof = width of fabric Cut from Red fabric: 1 strip measuring 5" x wof; 3 strips measuring 4 ½" x wof Cut from Blue fabric: 1 strip measuring 5" x wof; 3 strips measuring 4 ½" x wof. Cut from White fabric: 1 strip measuring 4 ½" x wof; 4 strips measuring 2 ½" x wof

Challenge Rules

How do you participate? It's easy!!!

- Complete a registration form. Dueonor before Jan 10th 2024
- List the steps that you need to take to complete this project. Or If you have more than one of these projects, list the steps for each you want to work on.

<u>NOTE</u>: Projects should be already be 'in progress' in some form; cut out, part sewn, etc.

Those of you who are high achievers may want to finish one entire project every month. But those of us that are not so inclined or don't have the time can proceed at a slower pace. Set realistic goals for completion each month. I want to make this fair and fun for everyone. The intent is to liberate those poor fabrics from their lonely existence.

- List the steps that you will complete that month. NO, you can't send it out to get longarm quilted and claim that as the step you have completed that month! However, you can bind it and claim that as your step.

Don't forget to keep a copy of this form for yourself so that you remember what you need to work on each month and you can check it off when completed.
- You will have 1 month to complete each set of steps that you have listed. You can complete the steps for each month in any order that suits you. When you reach your goal(s), send a picture to auntjudysattic@gmail.com. Please bring the finished item to Show and Tell at Terrific Tuesday each month so everyone can see your fantastic progress.
- Names of those who have completed their Challenge for the month and have sent or posted a picture before each monthly deadline will be put into a drawing for a Small Monthly Prize.
