find your pattern now. It doesn't have to be a **Christmas** design



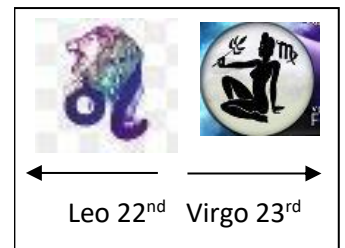
