ZOOM Arizona Quilt Study Group



It will run like our annual PhD Quilt Event in that you will need to report monthly as to your progress with photos or at Show and Tell on Terrific Tuesdays, however this will just be one project. Anyone may participate, the more the merrier. Monthly door prize drawing will be held and awarded, and a Grand Prize Drawing will be held the 1st of November.

Each year, the QOV Foundation sponsors a Block Drive. These blocks are used to make quilts for veterans in areas where there is no organized QOV group. For 2020, all members were asked to sew 9 Patch blocks in blue and white or red and white. We started with a goal of 1,000 and quickly realized that number would be reached way before the end of the year. In total, The Southwest Valor Quilters made 2,076 blocks – enough for over 100 quilts. We would like to thank Nancy Tittman (over 1,000 blocks) and Bonnie Davis (over 400 blocks) for their efforts in making this a success.
