

## Washington Stars Quilt Guild 2020 Challenge Guidelines:

### “Twenty Twenty”

The 2020 Challenge is open to all Washington Start Quilt Guild members regardless of skill level. This Challenge reflects the guild’s 20th Anniversary by encouraging members to create a piece that reflects the theme of “Twenty Twenty.”

Members can create pieces as literal as the word “twenty” printed on fabric 20 times to abstract (20 wisps of fabric spread across a fabric field) and everything in between. We encourage participants to stretch their creative muscles as they design their entries. We hope to see pieces that represent the guild’s broad range of quilting talents from traditional to modern to art quilts.

Each piece must conform to the definition of a “quilt” (usually described as two or more pieces of fabric joined together by stitch or other methods). However, feel free to stretch that definition if need be to fulfill your design goals.

Your quilt must be no bigger than 40 inches on a side or 40 inches in diameter. There is no minimum size. Remember that the artwork will need a sleeve and a label. The piece also needs an appreciable amount of black. Participants decide what constitutes an appreciable amount.

All challenge entries will be due at the November Business meeting. Everyone who submits one or more pieces will have their names entered in a drawing for one of four \$25 gift cards. Names for all four gift cards will be drawn at the meeting. Names will be entered once regardless of the number of pieces submitted.

All of the “Twenty Twenty” wall hangings/quilts will be hung at the guild’s 20th Anniversary Celebration in December.
