ZIG-ZAG

Reminiscent of the insignia of childhood hero, Zorro, Zig-zag is one of the most eye-catching Seminole designs. Depending on color placement it can easily be the centerpiece of a Seminole quilt. Once sewn into a quilt, the band measures $41" \times 6"$ (104.1 cm x 15.2 cm).

STRIP SETS. Cut eight strips of fabric, selvage to selvage, as follows:


Two 1" (2.5 cm) strips of Fabric A

Two 13/8" (3.5 cm) strips of Fabric B

Two 15/8" (4.1 cm) strips of Fabric C

Two 27/8" (7.3 cm) strips of Fabric D

Stitch together lengthwise as shown to form two strip sets.



SECTIONS. Stitch segments of equal width together edge to edge into three sections as shown. Square off the ends by slicing through each section once and transferring the slice to the opposite end. Both ends will now be square. Try to slice in the same place on all three sections.

BAND. Join the sections edge to edge as shown, matching seamlines, to complete the Zig-zag band. Fingerpress seams to interlock.
