## Class Date/Time:

1-101 Tucker Trimmer $1^{\circledR}$ and Shaded Four Patch Learn how to use a Tucker Trimmer $1^{\circledR}$ to create half square triangles, quarter square triangles, and combination units. You will also learn how to expand the use of your Tucker Trimmer $1^{\circledR}$ by creating a Shaded Four Patch unit. By using Deb Tucker's method of strip piecing the construction of a Shaded Four Patch, the quilter eliminates the need to stitch fabrics on an unsecured bias.
*Required tools: Tucker Trimmer $1^{\circledR}$ and Quilter's Magic Wand ${ }^{\circledR}$
*Required Technique Sheet: Shaded Four Patch
*Required Design Sheet: Tucker Trimer $1^{\circledR}$

## Basic Sewing Supplies

Sewing Machine with
Power cords and manual (just in case)
Thread
Machine Needles
Snips or Trimming Scissors
Seam ripper

## Basic Quilting Supplies

Rotary cutter with sharp blade
Marking Pencil (mechanical will do)
Small cutting Mat
Straight Edge Ruler approx. 6" $\times 12$ " or so Invisigrip (optional)
Best Press or light starch (optional)

## Pre-Cutting Directions:

Consider using your wonder fabric from your stash. I wonder what I was thinking when I bought this...since these classes are meant for practicing a technique.

Baggie 1: $\quad 2-5$ " squares of Fabric A $2-5$ " squares of Fabric B

Baggie 2: $\quad 2$ - $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares of Fabric A 2-5 $1 / 2$ " Squares of Fabric B $4-51 / 2$ " squares of Fabric C

Baggie 4: $\quad 1-23 / 4$ " strip $x$ WOF of background
$1-33 / 4$ " strip of WOF of
Fabric A
$2-5^{\prime \prime} \times 6$ " rectangles of Fabric B

Baggie 3: $\quad 4-5 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares of Fabric A $4-5 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares of Fabric B
