**2-1301 Shaded Nine Patch** If you loved the Shaded Four Patch unit, you will love the Shaded Nine Patch even more. Quilters can fool their friends into thinking that their quilt top required a ton of piecing when in fact, the Shaded Nine Patch can be made using a strip pieced method. This method also avoids having to deal with fabrics cut on the bias!

Required Tools: Tucker Trimmer<sup>®</sup> I or III
Required Technique Sheet: Shaded Nine Patch

## **Basic Sewing Supplies**

Sewing Machine with
power cords and manual (just in case)
Thread
Machine needles
Snips or trimming scissors
Seam ripper

## **Basic Quilting Supplies**

Rotary cutter with a sharp blade Marking Pencil (mechanical will do) Small cutting mat Straight edge ruler approx. 6" x 12" or so Invisigrip (Optional) Best Press or light starch (Optional)

<u>Fabric Requirements</u>: Fabrics will be cut during class. You will want to have three or more different prints to work with during class plus a solid. The more print options you give yourself, the more options you will have when creating a Shaded Nine Patch.

From the prints, you will want to be able to cut strips from 2 1/4" up to 3 1/2" wide by approximately 22" in length. Bring a minimum of 14 strips with you so that you have some options to make your selections. You can repeat some of the fabrics, but you don't want them to all be the same. Remember this is practice so don't be afraid to use some really ugly stash fabric that you have been pushing around.

From the solid fabrics, you can pre-cut at least (4) rectangles measuring 5 1/2" x 6 1/2".
