2-601 Geese on the Edge Jazz up your traditional log cabin block by adding some geese on the edges. Your friends will think you paper pieced these units, but you do not have to when you use the Wing Clipper I[®] tool from Deb Tucker's Studio 180 Design. Your biggest challenge will be how to arrange your units once you begin to discover the possibilities.

Required Tool: Wing Clipper I[®] and Tucker Trimmer[®] I or III
Required Design Sheet: Geese on the Edge

Basic Sewing Supplies

Sewing Machine with
power cords and manual (just in case)
Thread
Machine needles
Snips or trimming scissors
Seam ripper

Basic Quilting Supplies

Rotary cutter with a sharp blade
Marking Pencil (mechanical will do)
Small cutting mat
Straight edge ruler approx. 6" x 12" or so
Invisigrip (Optional)
Best Press or light starch (Optional)

Fabric Requirements:

Log strips: These can all be from the same fabric or you can go scrappy.

Cut (3-4) strips at 1 3/4" x WOF

Cut (2) 3" squares of fabric

Geese: These should be in contrast to your log strips.

Cut (4) 2 1/2" squares of fabric

Cut (4) 3 1/4" squares of fabric

Cut (2) 3" squares of fabric

Cut (4) 3 1/4" squares of fabric

NOTE: Please bring your entire Studio 180 Design "tool box" or tools and instructions. You may decide to use your favorite tool and you will want to have it on hand. **Please label your tools with your name.**
