This tote bag pattern includes three sizes! The medium and large sizes use a base stabilizer to enhance durability.

### Supply List

- “All the Things Tote” pattern.
- The fabric requirements are quite generous to allow for quilting and shrinkage.
  - **Note:** The Base Stabilizer is contained with a sleeve sewn onto the bottom of the bag from the Accent Fabric. I had enough fabric, in both the large and medium size, to use lining fabric.
  - **If you want to quilt your tote, please cut and complete all quilting prior to class so we can complete the tote within our timeframe.**
- Preferred **fabric marking tools:** Sewline Mechanical Pencil in White, Pilot FriXion Pens or Hera Marker.
- **Sewing Machine** in top working order with ¼” **patchwork foot** and **instruction manual.**
  - A walking foot is very helpful in managing the layers of fabric and Soft & Stable.
- A **new sewing machine needle**, such as Microtex Sharp 90/14
- **Neutral color thread** for piecing (grey, ecru or white) Mettler or Aurifil 50 wt
  - **Coordinating color thread** for binding, if desired.
- **Acrylic rulers** 6 ½” x 24” and/or 6 ½” x 12
- **Rotary cutter** (with relatively new blade)
- **Cutting mat** (optionally you can use the shop cutting mats)
- **Clips** are great for managing the multiple layers in bag making.
- **Scissors** and **seam ripper**
- Chair cushion if you would like to sit higher for sewing in class
