# JUST TOO EASY from Cozy Quilt Designs Teacher: Penni Albarran 

Okay, so I'm hooked. I had so much fun making these strip sets. The surprise comes after you cut your triangles and then open them up to see the combination of fabrics. Each one is different. You use $21 / 2 "$ strips. They can be from a "Bali Pop", a "Jelly Roll", or from your own collection of fabrics. I've made this many times, but this one is from a Red, White and Blue collection. I can't wait to see what you choose.

## Supplies:

- Book: Strip Tubing by Daniela Stout \& Georgette Dell'Orco of Cozy Quilts Design
- Ruler: The Strip Tube Ruler by Cozy Quilts Design
- A variety of $21 / 2$ " strips, enough for the size quilt you want to make (I used only 1 or 2 of any one fabric in my quilt):
Throw ( 52 " by $62 "$ ) - (40) strips OR (14) $1 / 4$ " yard cuts
Twin ( 72 " by $92 "$ ) - (96) strips OR (32) $1 / 4 "$ yard cuts
Queen ( 92 " by $92 "$ ) - (128) strips OR (43) $1 / 4 "$ yard cuts
King ( 102 " x 102") - ( 164 strips OR (55) $1 / 4$ " yard cuts
- Border yardages are also listed in the book:

Throw - $1^{\text {st }}$ border $1 / 2$ yard, $2^{\text {nd }}$ border 1 yard
Twin - $1^{\text {st }}$ border $2 / 3$ yard, $2^{\text {nd }}$ border $11 / 4$ yard
Queen - $1^{\text {st }}$ border $3 / 4$ yard, $2^{\text {nd }}$ border $11 / 3$ yard
King - $1^{\text {st }}$ border $3 / 4$ yard, $2^{\text {nd }}$ border $11 / 2$ yard

- For binding and backing yardages please refer to the book


## Also bring the usual class supplies:

- Sewing machine in good working order
- Thread, scissors, seam ripper, etc.
- Rotary cutter, Ruler, Mat, etc.
