

## Super Star Supply List

This is a really cool very large star, 80" X 80" and the technique is fun and may be new to you. If you want the wall hanging version, you may purchase that pattern instead to give you a smaller star, 30" X 40".

### Supplies:

- Pattern: Star Storm by Victoria Findley Wolfe (if you want the smaller version, get Star Storm Mini)
- Fabric: there is a two-toned center star and then 'stripes' radiating outward. Fabric A is the first fabric next to the star and J is the last fabric on the outside of the star.
  - Inner star light:  $\frac{1}{4}$  yard
  - Inner Star darker:  $\frac{1}{4}$  yard
  - Fabric A (light):  $\frac{3}{4}$  yard
  - Fabric A (darker):  $\frac{3}{4}$  yard
  - Fabric B: 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  yards
  - Fabric C (light):  $\frac{3}{4}$  yard
  - Fabric C (darker):  $\frac{3}{4}$  yard
  - Fabric D (stripe?): 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  yards
  - Fabric E (light):  $\frac{3}{4}$  yard
  - Fabric E (darker):  $\frac{3}{4}$  yard
  - Fabric F: 1 yard
  - Fabric G (light):  $\frac{1}{2}$  yard
  - Fabric G (darker):  $\frac{1}{2}$  yard
  - Fabric H (light):  $\frac{1}{2}$  yard
  - Fabric H (darker):  $\frac{1}{2}$  yard
  - Fabric I:  $\frac{1}{4}$  yard
  - Fabric J:  $\frac{1}{4}$  yard
  - Binding:  $\frac{3}{4}$  yard
  - Backing: 7  $\frac{1}{2}$  yards
- Other materials:
  - 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Blok-Lok square (or larger), Or 2" finished triangle papers, I recommend Star Singles by Spinning Star Design for this project (you will need 30 papers and there are 100 in each pack so maybe share with a friend or two.)
  - Wing Clipper by Deb Tucker (for flying geese units) If you don't own this, let me know before class so that I can give you alternate cutting instructions.
  - Sewing machine in good working order
  - 100 % cotton thread in a neutral color for piecing (Mettler, Aurifil or DMC)
  - Machine bobbins in same color
  - Rotary cutter and 18" X 24" mat
  - 6" X 12" ruler and 6" X 24" ruler (these are minimums, the rulers may be larger)
  - Thread clippers
  - Seam ripper, I will unsew for you in class, but you may need one at home)
  - Fine, straight pins
  - A sense of humor for class-machine piecing can be tricky, so don't let it get to you.
