

On the Street Where Tula Lives
Supply List

The finished quilt measures 64" X 72" and features 12 house blocks in 4 different patterns.

Fabrics:

- 2 yards of background
- 12 fat quarters of assorted prints for houses, including roofs
- 3 fat quarters for windows* (*I used 5/8 yard of one print)
- ½ yard binding (cut at 2 ¼", if you cut at 2 ½", use 5/8 yard)
- 4 ½ yards for backing

Additional materials for Class:

- Sewing machine in good working order (It might be a good idea to prewind a bobbin or two)
- Thread clippers
- Seam ripper (just in case)
- Rotary cutter and mat (I can give you the cutting instructions if you want to do some precutting before class, otherwise I will explain the cutting and you will do some of it in class. Since there are 4 different house patterns, decide which fabric will be for which House, A, B, C, and D.)
- (2) Acrylic Rulers; one at least 6" X 24", the other can be any width, but at least 12"
- Neutral, 50 weight, 100% cotton thread for piecing
- Fine, sharp straight pins and pincushion-I recommend a magnetic one.

This is not a difficult quilt to make, but since there are 4 different configurations, it is important to keep the pattern pieces separate. You may want to bring Post-It notes® and Ziploc® bags to stay organized.

I will guide you through the cutting and piecing of the 4 different patterns for this quilt in our 2 lessons and help you with the final layout and putting your top together.
