Simple Log Cabin Supply List

Finished Quilt Size: "Varies"

Introduction: Get back to the basics and make a traditional log cabin quilt with Jerry! However, here is the twist... learn to use the "bloc-loc" ruler to make this traditional quilt. Yes! You might have used this brand of ruler to make half-square triangles and maybe even flying-geese, but now is the time to try your hand with this magical ruler on a log cabin. You will love this ruler AND this quilt. Come have some fun and learn something new!!

Fabric Requirements – The amount of each fabric will depend upon the width of each segment in the log cabin blocks. In general, you can assume you need enough fabric for 2-3 strips of each color. To calculate how much fabric you need, use your finished-block width and add 5/8" to determine your cutting strip width. Then multiply that by 3 to get the minimum fabric requirement. Adjust as desired to ensure you have some extra for mistakes.

- 1/8 yard for block centers
- 16 pieces of assorted dark prints (see above)
- 16 pieces of assorted light prints (see above)
- Binding and Backing will vary

For example, if your finished segment width is like my sample at 1-1/2", you will be cutting strips at 2-1/8", so 3 strips would require 6-7" (assume 1/4 yard of each). Quilt will finish at approximately 70"x70"

Supply List

- One of the Bloc Loc Rulers. Each ruler can accommodate 2 sizes. For example we have two rulers in stock, one is for 3/4" and 1-1/2" finished while the other is 2" and 3" finished widths
- Sewing Machine, in working order
- Thread for piecing/bobbin
- Rotary cutter & cutting mat
- Iron and ironing mat (optional, but recommended)
- Standard sewing items (seam ripper, snips, etc)

Simple Log Cabin cutting Instructions for 1-1/2" block widths as in the shop sample.

If making another size, please contact Jerry for cutting instructions:

From you Block center fabric, cut:

- 16 – 3" squares

From each dark print, cut the following. Recommend cutting the largest to the smallest to make maximum use of each 2-1/8" strip.

- 1 – 2-1/8"x16-3/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x15-1/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x13-3/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x12-1/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x10-3/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x9-1/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x7-3/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x6-1/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x4-3/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x3-1/4" rectangle

From each light print, cut the following. Recommend cutting the largest to the smallest to make maximum use of each 2-1/8" strip.

- 1 – 2-1/8"x18-1/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x16-3/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x15-1/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x13-3/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x12-1/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x10-3/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x9-1/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x7-3/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x6-1/4" rectangle
- 1 – 2-1/8"x4-3/4" rectangle
