

SWEET STARS QUILT

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I always wanted to make a star block with a log cabin center. I've seen them here and there over the years and they always intrigued me. I designed my own block using 1 ½" strips (I used a "Honey Bun" product by Moda Fabrics) and 2 ½" strips (I used a matching "Jelly Roll" product also by Moda Fabrics). Lacking these, you could cut your own strips using your "stash" of fabrics or new yardage. I liked the look of setting the stars "on point", further using my 1 ½" strips for the sashing and cornerstones.

Quilt size: approximately 49 ½" x 63"

Supplies:

- Pattern: **Sweet Stars** (I will give you instructions in class as I don't have the sellable pattern yet. If it is finished at the time of this class, you will have a chance to purchase it if you like.)
- 1 "Jelly Roll" by Moda Fabrics **-OR-** at least **10** medium to dark 2 ½" strips and **20** light 2 ½" strips.
- 1 matching "Honey Bun" by Moda Fabrics, **-OR-** at least **20** medium to dark 1 ½" strips and **24** light 1 ½" strips.
*****IF YOU USE A "JELLY ROLL" AND "HONEY BUN", THEY SHOULD BE FROM THE SAME OR COORDINATING FABRIC LINE. ALSO, DEPENDING ON THE NUMBER OF DARKS AND LIGHTS, YOU MAY NEED TO SUPPLEMENT YOUR STRIPS*****
- A contrasting medium/dark 1 ½" strip to be used for the block centers and the cornerstones.
- 2 ½ yards of Fabric for the setting and corner triangles and border.
- In addition to the regular quilting rulers: **Flip 'n Set Ruler** by EZQuilting.

Also:

- Sewing machine in good working order, thread, pins, scissors, seam ripper, cutting mat, rulers, rotary cutter, etc.
