

Quilt Ikebana

Supplies for class

- 1 background fabric 18" wide x 30" long. Neutral or light colored, solid or tone-on-tone batik.
- 1 fat quarter of Oriental or other fabric for vase (approximately 9" x 12" piece needed).
Bringing a fat quarter will allow you to fussy cut the design.
- 1 fat quarter of patterned fabric for table (approximately 6" x 13" piece needed). You may want to fussy cut this too.
- Batik scraps for calla lilies, at least 4" x 4", in a dark and lighter shade of the same color, for blossoms. Calla lilies can be orange, yellow, pink, purple, fuchsia, white, golden yellow.
- Batik scrap for calla lily stems, dark green about 7" x 4"
- Batik scrap for cat tails, dark brown piece about 4" x 7" for heads, camel colored piece about 9" x 4" for stems
- Batik scrap for fern, medium green piece about 8" x 9"
- Small batik scrap of bright yellow or orange for flower centers
- 1 yard fusible web (I like Lt. Steam-A-Seam 2 as it has a temporary stick and is repositionable.) Wonder Under or Lt. Heat and Bond can also be used.
- 18" x 20" or larger Applique Pressing Sheet
- Small sharp scissors, paper scissors
- Washable fabric marker
- Pencil, eraser, ruler
- Straight pins

Supplies to finish quilt at home (finished size 24" wide x 36" long)

- Iron and ironing surface
- Sewing machine with straight stitch, walking foot and free motion foot
- ¼ yard (not a fat quarter) of fabric for inner border, solid or print to blend or contrast with background
- 1-1½ yards of fabric for outer border. I used a border print. Amount needed depends on the directionality of the print and whether you want to use this fabric for binding.
- ½ yard solid color fabric for binding if not using same fabric as outer border
- Thin batting, approximately 30" x 42".
- 1-¼ yards of fabric for backing
- Threads to match background, border and fabrics for your design
- Rotary cutter, mat, ruler
- Quilting pins
