

Mini-Quilt Curves Series
SUNRISE - #1401

A 15" square mini-quilt you can make in a day. Self-made bias tape covers the raw edges of curvy lines placed on a muslin foundation. Add some sew-and-flip sections to break up the space and add small pieces.

Supplies:

- 17-18" square of freezer paper
- 17-18" square of preshrunk muslin
- 17-18" square of backing fabric
- 16" square of thin batting or flannel
- Thread in colors to match the bias strips
- Permanent extra-fine black marking pen
- Opt. - Temporary basting spray

Fabric for Mini-Quilt: Batiks, hand dyed fabrics and other contemporary cottons work well for your mini-quilt. Use the colors suggested by the cover photograph or customize your mini-quilt by choosing a unique, personal palette.

Fabric A - 9 1/2" x 16" piece

B - 2" x 11" "

C - 2" x 12" "

D - 7" x 21" "

E - 11" x 22" "

F - 3" x 6" "

G - 2" x 10" "

H - 2" x 10" "

I - 3" x 4" "

J - 4" x 10" "

K - 8" x 9" "

L through CC - small scraps about 3" x 3" each

10 pieces 1" wide bias-cut strips, 6" - 25" long

2 strips, the width of the fabric x 2" for quilt binding

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
