## Spotlight on Deb and Cindy

Cyndi and Linda are so grateful to be working with an amazing staff. We thought it would be fun for you to get to know them. This time, our spotlight shines on Deb Antal and Cindy Goodwin.

Deb had an early start to sewing and quilting, at her grandma's knee. She began with hand stitching, then progressed to a treadle sewing machine. After taking Home Ec in high school, she made most of her own clothes. Sewing took a pause in her life when she was raising a family, though she continued to do hand work and sold Creative Circle hand embroidery patterns and kits through home party sales.

Many years later, a friend who was a member of the quilters group in Newfield, brought her back to sewing and started teaching her to quilt. Before long, the two of them found Quilters Corner and began taking classes, which she still loves to do. Deb especially is drawn to patterns by Elizabeth Hartman, and most recently enjoyed making three variations of the Nashville Quilt.

After working in schools for 31 years and being involved in her community, Deb knows a lot of people and is pleasantly surprised to find out that so many of them sew and quilt. She says she is excited to work at Quilters Corner. It's color therapy, it warms her heart and supports her hobby.

Cindy was introduced to sewing in Home Ec in school, and as a young mom, made some clothes for her children. It was when she became a grandma that her interest in sewing and quilting really bloomed. She made a quilt for each grandchild, learning on the go. Those early quilts were all tied, as she hadn't learned to quilt the layers together. Cindy likes to keep learning new things, and jumped in to quilting with a long arm machine from Quilters Corner in 2008.



Before long, people were asking her to quilt for hire, and now she has a thriving long arm business. Cindy is also proficient at machine embroidery and embroiders the names on all the nurse's uniforms at Guthrie, where she also works part time. She loves being on staff at Quilters Corner—the customers, other staff members, the atmosphere, and the constant exposure to new ideas and new products all make her happy. She just finished a grad quilt for one grandson and a baby quilt for another, beautifully machine quilted by her this time.

## Summer Block of the Week

By the Bay is the 2022 summer weekly program for Quilters Corner. Our 65" x 80" quilt featuring dreamy blues with a hint of green will add summertime freshness to your home, cottage or boat!

Every week starting Monday, June 20, you will receive two 13.5" x 21" cuts of blue fabrics (equaling 3/8 yard) – one light



and one medium/dark. We give you a free pattern and you provide the background of your choice. You will also need a Cake Mix recipe pad #11 to complete the foundation piecing.

How does it work? Just visit the shop weekly to pick up your blues. We'll release a new set each Monday for 11 weeks. The cost is \$5.99 per week. However, if you\* pick up your fabric in the shop the week they are released, you will get a \$2 discount for that week! Call or stop in today to sign up. Supplies are limited.

\*Sending a friend or family member to pick up your blues does not count. You may sign up for more than one set of blues, but the discount only applies to the first set.

## New Kits

### Backyard Friends

Who knew bugs could be so cute? You will want them to be your backyard friends! Make this fun wallhanging by Amy Bradley Designs, using quick and easy fusible appliqué. Stitch them on with a blanket stitch or another favorite appliqué stitch. Our version is bright, cheerful, and sure to delight young backyard adventurers. The finished size is 38" x 46". Pattern and kit available.



### Cats and Birds

Cat and Birds is another charming quilt by Tone Finnanger aka Tilda. If you are a cat lover, this quilt is irresistible! The pattern is in the book *Quilts from Tilda's Studio* which also has many other darling projects. We have a kit (52.5" x 73.5") that matches our sample minus the borders. The sample maker wanted a larger quilt so she added a small inner and large outer border.



### Kinfolk

Kinfolk is a modern baby quilt that abstractly spells out "LOVE", and love it, we do! The pattern includes instructions to make each letter block into a wall quilt or a pillow, so we made both. Be sure to see them next time you come to visit. Our kit features lovely Tilda fabrics and makes a nice wall size quilt with a finished size of 44" x 44". Give some "LOVE" to the new baby in your life!



### Workout Quilt

With many colorful fabrics and assorted neutral backgrounds, the Workout Quilt is a stunner! Using the Wonder Curve ruler makes cutting the curved blocks easy. We used the Stairstepper block in the book *Wonderful Curves, Sampler Quilt Block Book*, which has patterns for 30 different quilt blocks. Need help getting started? Take a class with Linda who will guide you through using the ruler, sewing curves and making the block. Book, ruler and kit available or bust your stash!



### Up North Quilt

Here is a throw size quilt that we think is perfect for the outdoor enthusiast or for anyone who thinks campers are the cutest! This entire pattern uses standard piecing and features detailed instructions, diagrams and tags to label your cuts of fabric - making it a great pattern for the ambitious beginner and up! The pattern and a kit featuring our fabric choices are available. Finished size is 59 1/2" x 68 3/4".



## New Patterns

### PHD Project Bag

For quilters, PHD can mean Project Half Done! This pattern includes detailed instructions for making your own 10" x 11.5" project bag. The clear vinyl lets you see your fabric and supplies at a glance, and how far along you are with your project. The zipper keeps everything safe. This is a great way to organize your works in progress smartly. Look for a class with Ruthanne in June.



### Tea Party Dress

With over 190 combinations possible, the Tea Party Dress will quickly become a favorite pattern! It has so many options to finish each aspect of the dress that you will never get tired of sewing quick, one-of-a-kind dresses. Gail made our adorable rayon sample. Look for her class! Pattern includes Size 0 to Size 8. We also have Baby Tea Party Dress and Teen Tea Party Dress patterns, with unique variations.



### Reading Pillow Pattern

This pillow pattern is fun and quick to sew and has a handy pocket for a book. It makes a great gift! This pattern includes two sizes: one that will fit an 18" pillow form and a larger size that will fit a standard twin pillow. Also included are appliqué instructions and patterns for the entire alphabet so you can add a message (READ), or a name to the front of the pillow.



## New Wall Hangings

### Birdhouse for Wrent

This is a beautiful pattern by Patch Abilities, with amazing detail. A cheerful wren sits atop a rustic birdhouse that was in search of a tenant. This fusible, machine appliqué project is perfect for those who have a little hand embroidery experience. It includes beginner tips, an enlarged layout guide and complete binding instructions. Finished size is 6"x22". Pattern and kit available, as well as an optional quilt hanger.



### Hollyhocks

Hollyhocks is another lovely beginner friendly, fusible machine appliqué project by Patch Abilities. The bright flowers and picket fence will add cheer to any home. The finished size is 6 1/2" x 21". A small amount of hand embroidery embellishment will be needed. Patch Abilities includes clear directions for those new to fusible appliqué, transferring words to fabric, hand embroidery stitches, even binding. Pattern and kit available, as well as an optional quilt hanger.

### **Alterations with Stephanie Allen**

Bring your misfit clothing items and Stephanie will teach you how to fix or alter them. 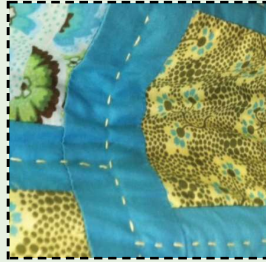
### PHD Project Bag with Ruthann Stillwell

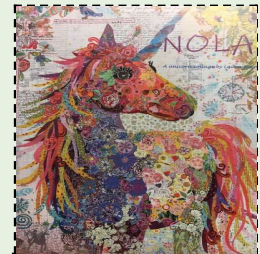
### Crisscross Apron with Beth Bowen

### Fabric Collage Quilt with Valerie

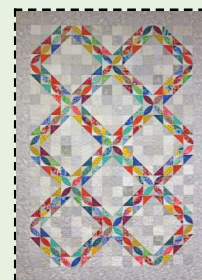
### Tilda's Garden with Cyndi

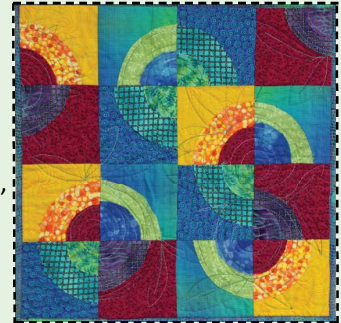

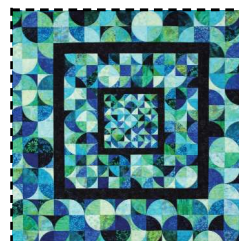


## Class Policies

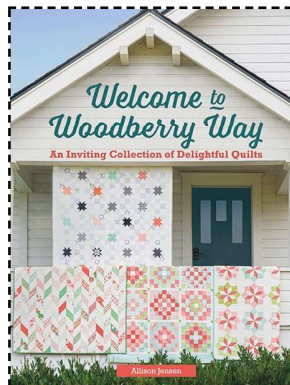

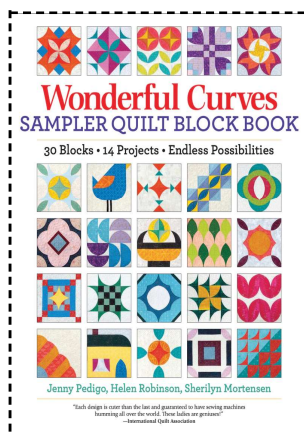
### Welcome to Woodberry Way

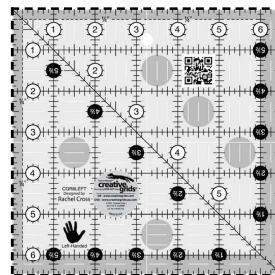

Regarding service and troubleshooting, electronics

and computerized machines are often easier to diagnose. When you've asked the machine to perform something it is not able to do, sensors will automatically stop it before causing damage and display a message of "main motor overload." Wait until the message disappears. If you get prolonged messages, a blank screen or the inability to move forward, simply turn it off and wait at least 1 minute before turning it back on. This will reboot and usually clear the machine.

Computerized screens may be familiar to operate, with functions quite similar to those of phones, tablets and computers. This technology is a rewarding and convenient combination of computerized and mechanical operation which provides endless hours of creativity.
