Spotlight on Sharon and Mari

Education is very important to us here at Quilters Corner, whether for new owners of sewing machines or in our wide variety of classes. Cyndi and Linda are so pleased with our excellent teachers and thought you would like to get to know them. This time, our spotlight shines on Sharon Darlow and Mari Townsend.

There was always a sewing machine in the house when Sharon was growing up, and she learned to use it fairly early, but it was after she married that she began to sew more. Maternity clothes, stuffed animals, and Halloween costumes were a big focus during her child-rearing years. After moving to this area, she enjoyed making corded bowls to sell at the Trumansburg Craft Fair. Her profession as a "fun science teacher" in middle school has kept her very busy, but about three years ago she decided she wanted quilt making to be her hobby after she retires, and she'd better learn how. She took Cyndi's Learn to Quilt series by zoom during the pandemic, bought a good sewing machine from QC, and now enjoys the entire process of making her own quilts.

Two years ago, Sharon bought an embroidery machine and jumped in big. Lately, she has been making shop samples for QC, so you can see her work hanging in the store. Combining her love of sewing and her skill as a teacher has been pretty natural, and students enjoy her classes in embroidery, fusible appliqué and the popular Sew Together bag.

Mari learned to quilt when she was 12 or 13, and she and her mom took a class at the local art center in her hometown. Her mom continued with quilting, but it was years later, after college and law school, that Mari had time enough to take it up in a big



way. She took a class at QC in 2004, and has been quilting ever since. Her current project is an appliqué Block of the Month project designed by Sarah Fielke called Secret Garden. Mari shows and sells her work in the Black Cat Gallery in Owego, NY.

Mari bought a Singer Featherweight in 2008 as a gift for her mom, and because they enjoy sharing their quilting lives — and may or may not even be competitive — she soon decided she needed one, too. Her interest in older sewing machines has grown to a sizable collection. Mari learned to service Featherweights from Sharon Stroud, a beloved QC teacher, and when Sharon stepped away from teaching, she began to teach our Featherweight Cleaning and Maintenance class. She wants to help other people share her joy in making old things work again and loves it when her students exclaim "That wasn't so hard!"

Block of the Month

Windsong was designed by Toni Steere of Wind and a Prayer, and it features 13 Tonga batik fabrics in warm and cool neutral earth tones. Traditional piecing techniques are used and this twelve month program offers a variety



of block and fabric combinations.

You will see how a simple change in color can affect the block appearance. The finished size is 108" square. You can choose to receive kits monthly or as a complete kit.

New Patterns

Winter Sports from Amanda Murphy showcases several different

sports from ice skating to snow boarding! Make the whole quilt or choose a sport to make as a wall hanging. This would make a great gift for any winter sports enthusiast. Fun to make using fusible appliqué, it is beginner friendly or for those of you who use cutting machines, an SVG download code is included. The quilt size is 69" x 87".

Quiet Place by Deb Eggers features a cozy cabin in the winter woods. The majority of the quilt is simple piecing with cheery cardinal and pine cone appliqués cafe around the outer borders. The step-by-step directions include clear diagrams.

Calico Quilt Seeds Patterns by Lori Holt of Bee in my Bonnet is a pattern series for 6 different vegetable quilt blocks. Each seed packet has instructions to make 1 vegetable quilt block. No templates are required. Each block finishes at 16" x 18" so you can mix and match and watch your garden grow. We've made kits for the pumpkin, tomatoes and the corn and peas. 

What is Sashiko?

Sashiko is a Japanese hand stitching style that is hundreds of

years old. Working class people could not afford cotton fabric, so they hand stitched cotton thread on layers of thin fabric in order to strengthen it and to provide extra warmth during the cold winter months. Preserved examples range from fisherman's coats to baby blankets. Today it has spread all over



the world, and we see it being used for mending, repairing and for decoration, typically with white cotton thread on a deep indigo background. Look for Gail's classes this winter to explore Sashiko for yourself.

Here are some of the supplies you will need to get started on your Sashiko journey:

Sashiko Thread: Our Sashiko threads are 100% long-staple cotton that give great definition to the stitches and last long. Strands are tightly spun to be extra sturdy and cannot be separated, unlike embroidery floss. We offer a beautiful variety of colors in a matte finish.

Sashiko Needles: Sashiko needles do not bend like embroidery needles, so you can load lots of stitches on the needle before pulling the thread through. They have a large eye for thick sashiko thread, and a very sharp point.

Preprinted cotton fabric or cotton/linen blends: The printed design on these fabrics disappears when washed with water, leaving only your beautiful art behind. We have an excellent

New Ruler

Unlike any ruler you've seen before, the 6 1/2" square glow ruler

is designed to bring light where you need it – the lines of your ruler! Great for both light and dark fabrics, this ruler has been designed to make fussy cutting easier. The ruler lights up the fabric, helping you see details, and making for more accurate fussy cuts.



The Glow Ruler has a battery and is recharged with a USB-C cable. The Glow Ruler can also be used when the light is off. The battery lasts 6-8 hours on a full charge. Available at the end of February.

Linda's Tech Corner

Let's talk about bobbin cases – the part of our machine which holds the bobbin.

They are brand specific, and may be top loading or bottom loading.

A top loading or drop in bobbin case is placed inside the circular part of your machine known as the hook. It will have a bit of play,



meaning it will move a little bit. Hold the bobbin so the thread comes off to form a P. Without removing the case, drop the bobbin in. Insert the thread into the little slot between the tension spring blade and the bobbin case. Listen for a little click to be sure tension is engaged.

A bottom loading bobbin case is removed to load the bobbin. The bobbin should have the thread come off to form a 9 or q. Place the bobbin into the case and insert the thread into the bobbin tension slot. The case has a small latch to hold while placing it properly into the hook area. With a bit of pressure and sometimes a snap it is seated in place.

To keep your machine stitching well, regularly inspect the bobbin case for stray thread, lint or debris that may have become impacted and carefully clean it and the hook area. Also check for any burrs from a needle strike which could cause thread to catch or snag and cause thread jams.
