Spotlight on Kristin

Cyndi and Linda are so grateful to be working with such an amazing staff. We thought it would be fun for you to get to know them. This time, our spotlight shines on Kristin Thompson.

Kristin started sewing as a child in New Brunswick, Canada, especially enjoying handwork such as embroidery and cross stitch. She ventured into doll clothes and made a whole wardrobe for her sister's doll. A decade plus later, she was a young married woman, expecting her first child and living in Salt Lake City when the quilting bug caught her. She learned the old ways from experienced Mormon quilters: everything was by hand, using scissors, needle and thread.

Two young children later, her family moved to Ithaca in June of 1995. Linda remembers the first time Kristin stopped into our first little 700 square foot shop. She was holding onto her toddler's hand and so pleased to see we had opened. By the following year, Quilters Corner had moved to a larger space and Kristin was teaching hand applique. No one remembers when she began working in the shop. She recalls just showing up often until she found jobs to do.

Kristin continues to teach many classes at Quilters Corner and has an ever growing following of students. She still loves the peacefulness of hand work, but has developed mastery over many sewing machine techniques as well. She is also our primary book, pattern, gifts and notions buyer. With her oversight of the colorful samples that cover every wall in the shop, she is largely responsible for the delighted gasps we hear when new people enter Quilters Corner.






Linda's Tech Corner

Basic, routine care of your sewing machine will help to provide trouble-free sewing and increase the life of your machine.

There are some things you can do at home. How much you use your machine and the types of fabric you sew determines how often you should perform routine maintenance. If you sew often and use fabrics that shed a



If you are a moderate user, then a cleaning

every few months will suffice. Unplug your machine, remove the throat plate and use a brush to collect any lint, thread and debris floating or compacted under the plate, between the feed dog teeth and around the hook area. Remove and inspect the bobbin case and remove any lint you find. Replace the needle if you hear a "thunk" as it penetrates the surface of your work, or if you notice skipped stitches.

A good rule of thumb is to replace your needle every 4-6 hours of sewing time, depending on the type of fabric. Be sure to change and use the proper needle for the task at hand. An annual service and cleaning performed by a technician is recommended to keep your machine properly lubricated and in top form.


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New Books

array of gridded quilting designs with detailed diagrams and instructions. This is a book that will take your machine quilting to the next level.


The second book is by Christa Watson called 99 Machine Quilting Designs.

Containing easy designs for both walking foot and free motion, Christa provides photos and descriptions to set you up for success. This is a good book for quilters who may be quilting for the first time on their home



sewing machine.

Blackberg, Blackberg Edition,
contains 11 lovely traditional
quilt designs ranging from a
small table topper to a twinsize quilt. All but one project
can be machine pieced, but
most include helpful tips and
templates for hand piecing too.
