Spotlight on Liz Navickas

Education is very important to us here at Quilters Corner, whether for new owners of sewing machines, or in our wide variety of classes. Cyndi and Linda are so pleased with our excellent teachers and thought you would like to get to know some of them. This time, our spotlight shines on Liz Navickas.

Liz remembers making Barbie clothes on her mom's old black Singer at about age 10. She pieced them from small cotton samples with pinked edges that came in the mail. 4H sewing lessons followed, where she learned to read patterns and sew clothes. A highlight was winning a blue ribbon at a state fair for her kelly green bell bottom pants and matching bolero vest with gold trim and gold frog closures!

Liz bought her first sewing machine during college, and made culottes and halter dresses. Later she made clothes for her children. With a career as a high school math and computer science teacher, Liz kept being creative by designing hand embroidery samplers. She sold her patterns at trade shows and to needle work magazines.

She tried quilting and found she enjoyed the piecing of the top less than the stitching of the three layers. Texture really drew her in! When retirement loomed, she bought a long arm quilting machine, and now quilts for others as well as her own creations. We at Quilters Corner find her free motion work to be exceptional.

The pattern includes two sizes, small 38" x 39" and large 75" x 77", and includes a horse, cow, goat, sheep, pig, chicken, bee, and sunflower. Look for a sample and kit coming soon. We have



made several of Elizabeth Hartman quilts over the years and have found her patterns to not only be cute as the dickens but also organized and clear.

The Produce Section

Here is another wonderful pattern from Elizabeth Hartman that features a shopping cart full of fresh fruit, and as always with her patterns, all blocks are made with conventional patchwork – no paper piecing! The pattern includes instructions for two sizes, 38" x 38" or 75" x 75". Wouldn't the pattern be great



for a set of placemats or a table runner? Look for a pack of fruity fat quarters to get you started.

Love Cats

This fat quarter friendly quilt from Villa Rosa designs, is purrfect for your favorite cat lover. Our kit is a collection of fun kitty fabrics and coordinating colorful prints. The finished size is 52" x 65" and is a great pattern for a beginner. Think about a Minkee backing for an extra cozy quilt.



New Bag

Field Bag

This stylish bag is ideal for knitting, sewing,

embroidery or other works in progress. It features a roomy main compartment with interior pockets designed for corralling tools patterns and more. Draw strings close it up so nothing



falls out and a handy wrist strap means you can take it along easily. Look for a class with Jackie.

Square Deal

In our fall newsletter we featured the book Quilts from Quarters, that has 12 clever quilt patterns to make using fat or long quarters. The Square Deal pattern from the book really lets the fabric do the talking. Our sample and kit are made with beautiful Kaffe Fassett fabrics in gorgeous blues. This is a quick and easy quilt to sew and would look great with any large prints you want



to feature. QC is offering a class to make this quilt with Jackie, and it would be a great one for beginners.

Strike Quilt

This is a Halfsies quilt pattern that calls for six half-yards: two lights, two mediums and two darks. Instructions for a larger size are also included. It uses simple piecing with maximum impact. We were excited to use the adorable Firefly line by Sarah Watts of Ruby Star for our sample and we made the larger



size using yard pieces rather than half yards. Kit and pattern available. Look for a class coming this spring.

Block of the Month

Amish With a Twist V

From Nancy Rink Designs comes her fifth Amish

themed block of the month. For 10 months, you will create twelve sampler style blocks, each in a different Centennial Solids color family, some of which were created by Marcus Fabrics just for this program. The



blocks are framed in a midnight navy background and it's all brought together with a rich boysenberry border for an authentic Amish touch. The finished size of the quilt is 98" x 98" and is a great quilt for a confident beginner.

How does the Block of the Month work? Sign up at the shop (or call). Purchase the pattern booklet Amish With a Twist V, \$30. Each month for 10 months you will receive a kit with fabric to make the blocks, \$21.99/month. We will call you the first of each month to let you know your kit is ready and then you can pick it up at the shop or we will mail it to you.

Sometimes we need to make a quilt and finish it sooner than 10 months. For those of you who want the whole kit right away, we will have complete kits available. We are offering the complete kit for \$199, a \$20 savings.





Kristin Loves Hand Stitching!

One of the good things that has come out of the pandemic for me

is a rekindling of my lifelong interest in hand stitching, especially embroidery. During lock down, Sue Spargo, an expert in wool and hand embroidery, offered daily patterns and tutorials for 90 straight days on Instagram. I looked forward to these daily patterns and lessons. It gave me a sense of calm and normalcy in an otherwise abnormal and anxious time. Since then, I have been working on more and more wool projects and have made several



samples for the shop for which we have kits. We have been gradually introducing more wool and useful tools to meet your hand-stitching needs and hope to add more thread selection in the future.

My favorite resource is Sue's book *Creative Stitching*, which includes step by step concise written instructions, along with clear illustrations, for more than 70 of her favorite stitches. This guide is essential and is spiral bound for convenience. We have a great selection of hand needles including Tapestry, Chenille and Milliners in various sizes based on the size of thread you are using. Sue's needle packs are conveniently color coded to her threads, so you always know what needle to use with the weight of thread. We have Spoke Easy acrylic templates – great for accurate placement of spokes on wool circles. We also have Circle Easy, Hexagon Easy and Loop Easy tools (great for any stitch that requires loops such as a raised leaf). Another very useful product is the itty-bitty wool drizzle pad. This little pad stabilizes your needle, making it ideal for wrapped and caston stitches.

We have patterns and wool kits, project books from other authors, as well as a great selection of wool from small bits to larger background pieces in all sorts of wonderful colors.

If you have stitched in the past or have never stitched before you might want to join my class, The Gentle Art of Hand Embroidery. This is a two-hour monthly session where we explore one or two stitches while working on a project of your choice or just play on a practice piece. Come in and see what we have to offer. I hope we can inspire you to discover the Zen of hand stitching.

Quilt as Desired

dreaded three little words: Quilt as Desired. Angie Roux will lead you through a series of steps to determine the best quilting designs based on the top itself and your skill level & equipment. She will demo on the Baby Lock Coronet and give tips for



Great Rulers

10" Wonky Log Cabin Trim Tool


This new ruler puts a fun twist on a traditional block. It is designed to work with 2 ½" strips for both the logs and center squares, making it precut friendly. After adding each round of logs, place the appropriate centering square on the ruler over the center square of the block and trim. Since each round is trimmed before adding the next one, your



final trim squares up the block so it is ready to be used in your project. Look for the Sweet Sixteen pattern that uses this ruler and ask for a demo or take a class with Kristin.

Quick Trim Ruler

The Quick Trim ruler is not new but has many uses that we want to (re) acquaint you with. It's a handy size, 3 ½" x 12 ½" that does everything that a ruler that size should do plus more! Use the white 45-degree lines to cut binding and border strips perfectly as well as cut and trim flying geese units. Use the holes drilled in the center to draw circles up to 22". It has the usual Creative Grids gripper pads to hold ruler in place, reducing slipping and miss-cuts. It comes with fully illustrated step by step instructions but if you like a demo, designer Karen Montgomery has a fantastic tutorial



that you can access with a Smart phone. Go to the website www.creativegridsusa.com, or come into the shop for a demo. It is a remarkable ruler with many everyday uses.

180 Patchwork Quilt Blocks



Linda's Tech Corner

You probably haven't thought too much about the motor

on your sewing machine, but you should. When you plan to purchase a new machine, you'll want to consider the strength and size of its motor. With a larger, stronger motor you will experience better piercing power and speed. And while faster stitching may not be at the top of your wish list, piercing power probably is.



The stronger the motor, the better the piercing power.

Both Pfaff and Baby Lock machines have excellent needle piercing power, with higher level machines offering larger, stronger motors.

To keep your motor in the best condition possible, you will need to maintain a good routine of sewing with a sharp needle as well as an annual cleaning and servicing. As soon as you notice the needle getting dull, change it. A dull needle will often make a "thump, thump, thump," sound.

We recommend inserting a new needle at the start of every project, or after 8 to 10 hours of sewing. A dull needle makes the motor work harder to pierce the surface of your fabric. This will result in wearing down the motor brushes and in turn, prematurely wear out the motor and shortening the life of the machine.
