Spotlight on Stephanie

Education is very important to us here at Quilters Corner, whether it be for new owners of sewing machines, or in offering a wide variety of sewing classes – quilting, bag making, home dec, and clothing. Cyndi and Linda are so pleased with our excellent teachers and thought you would like to get to know some of them. This time, our spotlight is on Stephanie Allen.

Stephanie started sewing when she was five years old. Both of her grandmothers and her mother were avid sewers. She remembers working on a skirt with sunflowers and getting instruction from her piano-teaching mother. She would work away, and ask “What do I do next?” after one piano lesson ended and before another began. She enjoyed Home Ec in school and started college with that major in mind. She took all the sewing classes and loved them. Later, she changed majors, but retained a strong interest in sewing. Because store bought clothes generally don’t fit her petite frame, most of her wardrobe is handmade.

About five years ago, Stephanie started teaching sewing classes where she lived in South Carolina, then connected with us at Quilters Corner when she moved to this area. Stephanie has a blog, Thepetitesewist.com and an Instagram account, @thepetitesewist. She loves helping people, taking something that seems hard and making it fun. Sometimes her students have negative feelings about their body – and she tells them, “It’s not you, it’s the clothes!”

She feels that teaching is more effective in person, when students can see and handle the fabrics, but she has also become adept at teaching students online through Zoom in our classroom. She started teaching kids during the pandemic, and loves it! We recommend Stephanie’s class called “Know your



Knits” in which each student receives samples to learn which kind of knits are best for which type of clothing. We giggled when she suggested a class to make underwear, but it has been very popular. And her sports bra class... a customer whipped off her shirt to show us the best bra she’s ever worn, made in Stephanie’s class.

With Stephanie’s recommendations and advice, Quilters Corner has been adding a nice selection of knits to our shelves, rounding out our cotton fabric offerings. She is thrilled at the new addition of activewear and swimwear knits at the shop.

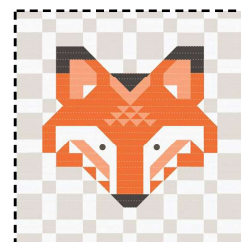


French Roses with Valerie

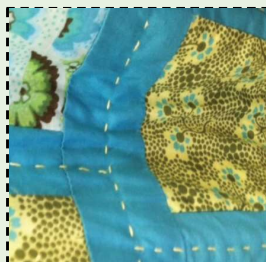
Learn to Quilt with Cyndi

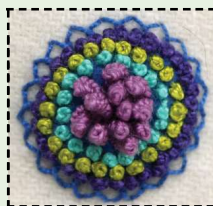
Intro to Machine Quilting with Cyndi

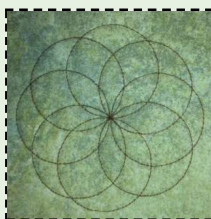

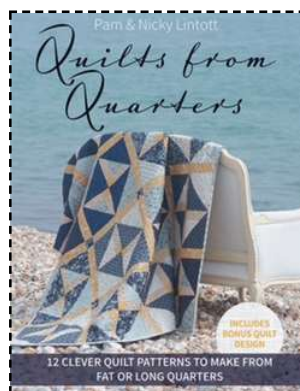

Linda's Tech Corner

Why are bobbins so important? They are doing half of the work and providing half of the thread when you create a stitch with your machine. We often forget about the bobbin, as it is out of sight while we are sewing, until we have a problem. Here are some things to check to avoid bobbin problems.

First, use the correct bobbin for your machine. Many of us have more than one machine. Even if machines are of the same brand, that does not guarantee they use the same bobbin. An incorrect bobbin will make it hard for the top thread to catch the bobbin thread and bring it up.

Next, make sure you have perfectly wound your bobbin. There may be a peg or specific position that your bobbin must be in BEFORE you begin winding. It is then correctly seated. Be sure not to let the thread slip under the bobbin and wind on the winding mechanism. This can get quite



messy and is hard to remove. When winding a bobbin, it is VERY important that the thread passes through some sort of pre-tension point. This provides specific tension on the thread as it winds onto the bobbin. Without this tension, you might wind a "mushy" bobbin. Also, be sure the thread is placed in all of the thread guides and look for the thread to move evenly up and down as it winds onto the bobbin. Use your finger lightly, if necessary, to ensure the thread is evenly wound.

When inserting your freshly wound bobbin into the bobbin case, refer to your manual for proper positioning. For most bottom loading bobbins, the thread must be spilling off the bobbin on the right, creating a "q" or a "9". Most top loading bobbins have the thread spilling off the left side of the bobbin creating a "p." Finally, make sure your bobbin thread is clicked into the tension spring of the bobbin case. For top loading bobbins, when the thread is pulled up to the surface of the machine, you should see it coming from the lower left. If it comes from the upper right, the thread is not held by the bobbin tension spring and needs to be corrected.
