Sunnyside

Sunnyside is a fun two color stash busting quilt. Grab a variety of fat quarters in two contrasting colors, add a splash of background, and you are all set. This is a great value since it includes directions for 6 sizes from Baby to King size and is perfect for advanced beginners. Our sample uses glorious Kaffe Fassett prints in blues and greens with a white background. Fat quarter bundles are available to get you started or let us help you choose a color palette.



Tube Socks

Bring back the spirit of the 80's and celebrate the iconic soccer gear of today with this colorful ode to tube socks. The pattern is in the booklet Warp + Weft by Modern Quilt Studio and features some fun and colorful quilts made with yarn dyes. What is a yarn dye? These are fabrics that are woven from individual yarns that are dyed before being woven. As a result, the pattern comes from the weaving of different colors. Fun fact, you



may find occasional knots on one side where the threads were knotted when they ran out during weaving. The knot-free side is known as the "face-side". Look for our kit and the booklet for Tube Socks and for our lovely selection of gorgeous yarn dyes. 47" x 78".

Is Autumn your favorite season? Celebrate beautiful fall colors with this lap size maple leaf quilt. We made our version in batiks. Simple construction with half square triangles makes this a quick project and suitable for beginners. It would be a great addition to your Thanksgiving décor. Kit and pattern available. The kit includes all the beautiful batiks needed to make the top, including binding. The finished size is 54" x 72".



Birds and Sunflowers

This gorgeous quilt featuring Tilda fabric, has four different types of blocks, assembled in vertical columns to create beautiful sunflowers. The bird blocks have a curved seam so they may be a little challenging but well worth the effort. The kit contains everything you need to make the top plus the binding. Cyndi, who made our sample, wanted a larger quilt, so she added a pieced inner border with her leftover fabric and a larger polka dot outer border. The



result is simply divine! Pattern in the book (sold separately) Sewing by Heart by Tone Finnanger, designer of Tilda fabric. There are 20 other charming sewing, patchwork, appliqué, and quilting projects in the book. Finished size is 50" x 76".

Mountain Gems

We love it when a pattern offers multiple designs with simple fabric cuts! Mountain Gems offers great design with instructions for Lap, Twin and Queen size quilts using convenient fat quarters and background yardage. Our sample is a Queen size using blue and greens with a Grunge background. We have assembled fat quarter packs for the Queen size but are happy to help you choose your own unique color



palette. You choose your favorite background.

Linda's Tech Corner

What is the best needle to use? A SHARP one!! The power of your machine's motor is only as efficient

for penetration as your needle is sharp. If your needle is well-used and dull, your machine will work harder to have the needle penetrate whatever fabric you are sewing. This adds undo stress and wears out the motor brushes prematurely, thus shortening the lifespan of your machine.



My recommendation is to replace your needle and clean your machine before you begin a new project, or when you begin a new phase of a larger project. Some recommend changing a needle after using up three bobbins. When your needle is dull, you can sometimes hear a "thump, thump" sound while sewing, sometimes you have skipped stitches or broken threads, and sometimes you can actually see the needle "pushing" the fabric down into the needle hole of the needle plate.

In general, sewing machine needles can be categorized according to type or purpose and size. Different fabrics and threads require specific tips and shapes. For example, there's a specific type for sewing stretch/knit fabric, one for topstitching or quilting through multiple layers, one for sewing denim, one for piercing through tightly woven materials such as silk or batiks, and another for

leather and cork. Fussy threads, like metallic or embroidery threads, need a special protective scarf on the needle to keep them from shredding.

The size of the needle refers to how thick the needle is. The larger the number, the thicker the needle. A thicker sized needle is meant to sew through denser fabrics such as denim, flannel, wool, canvas,



linen or a quilt, while a thinner sized needle is better used when sewing finer fabrics such as cotton, silk, polyester.

Each needle size and type is specifically designed for optimum performance in delivery of your chosen thread and penetration of your chosen material.

Next time you purchase machine needles at Quilters Corner, pick up a free ABC Pocket Guide from Schmetz needle company. It has great information about which needles are best for what purpose.
