- GO! Ohio Star-12" Finished (55174)
- GO! Strip Cutter-2-1/2" (2" Finished) (55017 or 55014)

#### **FABRIC REQUIREMENTS**

- Fabric 1 (Blue)—1-1/2 yards
- Fabric 2 (Green)—1-1/2 yards
- Fabric 3 (Yellow)—2 yards
- Fabric 4 (Orange)—1-1/2 yards
- Fabric 5 (Pink)—1-1/2 yards
- Fabric 6 (White)—2-1/2 yards
- Binding—1 yard
- Batting-75" x 90"
- Backing—6 yards

#### **CUTTING DIRECTIONS**

### Fabric 1:

- Cut 48—4" finished guarter square triangles
- Cut 4—4" finished squares
- Cut 7-2-1/2" x width of fabric (WOF) strips Sub cut into: 8-2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles and 8-2-1/2" x 16-1/2" rectangles

#### Fabric 2:

- Cut 48-4" finished quarter square triangles
- Cut 4—4" finished squares
- Cut 7—2-1/2" x WOF strips Sub cut into: 8-2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles and 8-2-1/2" x 16-1/2" rectangles

#### Fabric 3:

- Cut 48-4" finished quarter square triangles
- Cut 4—4" finished squares
- Cut 15—2-1/2" x WOF strips Sub cut 7 of the strips into: 8—2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles and 8—2-1/2" x 16-1/2" rectangles (Set aside remaining 8 strips for border)

#### Fabric 4:

- Cut 48—4" finished quarter square triangles
- Cut 4—4" finished squares
- Cut 7—2-1/2" x WOF strips Sub cut into: 8-2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles and 8-2-1/2" x 16-1/2" rectangles







#### Fabric 5:

- Cut 48—4" finished quarter square triangles
- Cut 4—4" finished squares
- Cut 7-2-1/2" x WOF strips Sub cut into: 8-2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles and 8-2-1/2" x 16-1/2" rectangles

#### Fabric 6:

- Cut 80—4" finished squares
- Cut 80—4" finished guarter square triangles

• Cut 9—2-1/2" x WOF strips

#### **SEWING DIRECTIONS**


- 1. Lay out two Fabric #5 Quarter Square Triangles (QST), one yellow QST, and one white QST as shown.
- 2. Sew triangles pressing seams towards Fabric #5.
- 3. Repeat to make a total of 16 QST blocks.
- 4. Lay out four QST blocks, one Fabric #4 square, and four Fabric #6 squares.
- 5. Sew blocks together, pressing seams in opposite direction.
- 6. Lay out pieced Ohio Star Block with two Fabric #3, 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles and two 2-1/2" x 16-1/2" rectangles.
- 7. Sew block together pressing towards Fabric #3 rectangles. Block should measure 16-1/2" x 16-1/2".
- 8. Make a total of four Block #1.
- 9. Repeat the previous eight Steps to make a total of four of each of the following combinations:
  - Block #2: (1) Fabric #2 Square, (4) Fabric #4 QSTs, (8) Fabric #3 QSTs, (4) Fabric #6 QSTs, (4) Fabric #6 Squares, (2) Fabric #4 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" Rectangles, and (2) Fabric #4 2-1/2" x 16-1/2" Rectangles
  - Block #3: (1) Fabric #1 Square, (4) Fabric #2 QSTs, (8) Fabric #4 QSTs, (4) Fabric #6 QSTs, (4) Fabric #6 Squares, (2) Fabric #2 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" Rectangles, and (2) Fabric #2 2-1/2" x 16-1/2" Rectangles
  - Block #4: (1) Fabric #5 Square, (4) Fabric #1 QSTs, (8) Fabric #2 QSTs, (4) Fabric #6 QSTs, (4) Fabric #6 Squares, (2) Fabric #1 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" Rectangles, and (2) Fabric #1 2-1/2" x 16-1/2" Rectangles
  - Block #5: (1) Fabric #3 Square, (4) Fabric #5 QSTs, (8) Fabric #1 QSTs, (4) Fabric #6 QSTs, (4) Fabric #6 Squares, (2) Fabric #5 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" Rectangles, and (2) Fabric #5 2-1/2" x 16-1/2" Rectangles





- 10. Lay out the pieced Ohio Star Blocks following the picture.
- 11. Sew blocks together pressing seams in opposite directions.
- 12. Sew together the remaining eight Fabric #3 strips along the short side.
- 13. Measure the length of the quilt in the center. Cut two borders to this length.
- 14. Pin and sew the borders onto the left and right sides of the quilt, pressing towards the borders.
- 15. Measure the width of the quilt in the center. Cut two borders to this length.
- 16. Pin and sew the borders onto the top and bottom of the quilt.

#### **QUILTING AND FINISHING**

- 1. Layer quilt top with batting and backing.
- 2. Pin or baste layers together.
- 3. Model was custom machine quilted.
- 4. Add binding, mitering the corners.
