





GO! Flying Rainbow Geese Throw Quilt

Finished Size 51" x 63"
Finished Block Size: 6" Blocks



GO!® Dies Used, Number of Shapes to Cut & Fabric Requirements

Fabric Color	Shape	GO! Dies Used	Number of Shapes to Cut	Fabric Required
7 Dark Fabrics		GO! Flying Geese-3½" x 6½" (3" x 6" Finished) (55456)	Cut 2—7" x width of fabric (WOF) strips. Lay fabric over the quarter square triangle (QST). Fanfold into 4" widths. Sub cut into 18 QSTs.	1/4 yard of each
7 Light Fabrics		GO! Flying Geese-3½" x 6½" (3" x 6" Finished) (55456)	Cut 2—5" x WOF strips. Lay fabric over the half square triangles (HSTs). Fanfold into 4" widths. Sub cut into 36 HSTs.	1/4 yard of each




Fabric Color	Shape	GO! Dies Used	Number of Shapes to Cut	Fabric Required
Blue		GO! Strip Cutter-2" (1½" Finished) (55025)	Cut 6—2" x WOF strips for inner border.	1/2 yard
Red		GO! Strip Cutter-3½" (3" Finished) (55032)	Cut 6—3½" x WOF strips for outer border.	1 yard

Additional Fabrics Needed:


- Binding—1/2 yard
- Backing—59" x 71" or 3¼ yards
- Batting—55" x 67"

Sewing Directions:

Flying Geese Blocks (9 of each color combination)

1. Lay out one 6" finished quarter square triangle (QST) and two 3" finished half square triangles (HSTs) as shown. 
2. Pin and sew together to form a flying geese unit. Press seams toward the HSTs. Make 18 of each color combination. 
3. Lay out, pin and sew two matching flying geese units together to make one flying geese block. Make a total of 9 blocks of each color combination. 

Assemble the Quilt Top

1. Referring to the quilt photo, the top left flying geese block is turned with the points going left, then the next block is facing down, the next one is facing right and the next one is facing up. This repeats until there are 7 blocks in the row. The next row has the same blocks facing the same way, but shifted to the left and then on the far right a new block color is added. 

2. Pin and sew 9 rows, each with 7 flying geese units. Press seams in alternating directions for each row.

3. Continue to assemble the quilt top in this manner.



Borders:

1. Stitch the 2" wide blue inner border together with a bias seam or end to end according to your preference.
2. Stitch the inner border to the long sides of the quilt first. Pin carefully, easing quilt top as needed to fit the border.
3. Stitch the inner border to the top and bottom of the quilt. Again, pin carefully, easing quilt top as needed to fit the border.
4. Press seam allowances to the inner border.
5. Stitch the 3½" red outer border together with a bias seam or end to end according to your preference.
6. Stitch the outer border to the long sides of the quilt first. Pin carefully, easing quilt top as needed to fit the border.
7. Stitch the outer border to the top and bottom of the quilt. Again, pin carefully, easing quilt top as needed to fit the border.
8. Press seam allowances toward the inner border.



Quilting and Finishing:

1. Layer batting between quilt top and backing.
2. Pin or baste layers together.
3. Quilt as desired.
4. Add binding, mitering corners.
