## GO! Big Crazy Spotlights Quilt

## Dies Needed:

GO! Big Crazy Quilt - 10" Finished (55861)
GO! Big Circle - 4", 6", 7", 8" (55462)
GO! Strip Cutter - 2-1/2" (2" Finished) (55014 or 55017)

Fabric Requirements:

Cut 1 -13 $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ x $131 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square from each print. Sub cut each into the set of 10 Crazy Quilt shapes A to J.

Gray Tonal Rotary Cutter Cut 4—10 $1 / 2$ " $\times 101 / 2$ " squares.

| Gray Tonal | $\begin{aligned} & \text { GO! Strip Cutter - } \\ & 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\left(2^{\prime \prime}\right. \\ & \text { Finished) (55014) } \end{aligned}$ | Cut $1 — 11^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Fanfold into $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ widths. Sub cut into $4-2$ " finished strips. Trim 2 strips to 2 " x 34 " finished lengths and trim the other 2 strips to 2 " $\times 30$ " finished lengths. |

| Dark Blue Tonal | $\begin{aligned} & \text { GO! Strip Cutter - } \\ & 2-1 / 2 "(2 " \\ & \text { Finished) }(55014) \end{aligned}$ | Cut 1-11" x WOF strips. Fanfold into $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ widths. Sub cut into 4-2" finished strips for binding. |
| Fusible | Scissors or Rotary Cutter | Cut 4-9" $\times$ 9" squares. |

## Sewing Directions:

Use $1 / 4$ " seams, unless otherwise indicated.

## Crazy Quilt Square Block

NOTE: Directions will be for one 10" finished block. Make 9 blocks.

1. Keep all the same shapes in the same stack. Lay out the shape stacks as the block is laid out.
2. Move the topmost Shape B fabric to the bottom of the stack. Move the two topmost Shape C fabric to the bottom of the stack. Continue moving the fabrics (three Shape D, four Shape E, etc) from the top of each stack until the topmost fabric on each stack is
 different from the other stacks.
3. Take the topmost Shape A, B and C fabrics and sew together.
4. Take the topmost Shape D and E fabrics and sew together.
5. Take the topmost Shape F and G fabrics and sew together.
6. Take the topmost Shape H, I and J fabrics and sew together.

7. Lay out these sections from Steps 3 to 6 to form a block.
8. Sew sections together to complete one Crazy Quilt Square Block.
9. Repeat Steps 3 to 8 to complete a total of 9 Crazy Quilt Square Blocks. There will be shapes leftover.

## Crazy Quilt Circle Block

NOTE: Directions will be for one 10 finished block. Make 4 blocks.

1. Fuse $1-9$ " $\times 9^{\prime \prime}$ fusible square to the back of $1-10$ " finished Crazy Quilt Square Block.

2. Position the fused block over the 8 " circle on the GO! Big Circle - 4", 6", 7", 8" (55462). Make sure that the fusible on the back is centered on the 8 " die and you can rotate the square block as you wish.
3. Cut only one fused block at a time and a 10" square cutting mat may be used.

4. Peel off the paper backing from the circle.

5. Center and fuse the circle to a $10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ gray tonal square.
6. Machine applique the edge of the circle down. Use a stabilizer if necessary. A feather stitch was used in the sample.


## Assemble the Quilt Top

1. Lay out blocks in 3 rows of 3 blocks each as shown in quilt diagram. Sew blocks together into rows. Press seams to one side.
2. Sew rows together. Press seams in opposite directions.
3. Sew 2 " $\times 30$ " finished gray tonal strips to opposite sides of the quilt. Press seams away from the quilt center.
4. Sew 2 " $\times 34$ " finished gray tonal strips to the remaining sides of the quilt. Press seams away from the quilt center.

## Quilting and Finishing

1. Layer batting between quilt top and backing.
2. Pin or baste layers together.
3. Quilt as desired.
4. Add binding, mitering corners.
