Finished Size: 50" x 50"







Dies Needed:

• GO! Bear's Paw-14" Finished (55461)

Fabric Requirements:

Fabric Color	Total Yardage	
Fabric A (Black)	1-1/4 yards	
Fabric B (White)	7/8 yards	
Fabric C (Red)	1-1/2 yards	
Batting	54" x 54"	
Backing	54" x 54"	





Cutting Directions:

Fabric Color	Die	Number of Shapes to Cut
Fabric A (Black)	GO! Bear's Paw-14" Finished (55461)	Cut 21—2 ½"W x 2 ½"H squares.
		Cut 64—2 ½"W x 2 ½"H half square triangles.
Fabric A Rotary	Rotary Cutter	Cut four blocks 6 ½" x 5 ½",
		Cut four right triangles 10" x 10" (the third side will be approximately 14-1/4")
		Cut four Triangles 14" x 14" (the third side will be approximately 20")
Fabric B (White)	GO! Bear's Paw-14" Finished (55461)	Cut 20—2 ½"W x 7"H rectangles.
Fabric B (White)	Rotary Cutter	Cut 2—3 ½" x 40 ½" strips.
		Cut 2—3 ½" x 46 ¼" strips.
Fabric C (Red)	GO! Bear's Paw-14" Finished (55461)	Cut 4—4 ½"W x 4 ½"H squares.
		Cut 64-2 ½"W x 2 ½"H half square triangles.
Fabric C (Red)	Rotary Cutter	Cut 2—4 ½" x 46 ¼" strips
		Cut 2—4 ½" x 54 ¼" strips





Sewing Directions:

Press all seams open and use 1/4" seams, unless otherwise indicated.

Bear's Paw Block Assembly

Unit 1

1. Sew one triangle of Fabric A to one triangle of Fabric C to make a half-square triangle (HST).



2. Sew together two HSTs.



Unit 2

3. Sew one triangle of Fabric C to one triangle of Fabric A to make an HST.



4. Sew together two HSTs.




Unit 3

5. Sew Unit 1 to the small square, as shown.



Unit 4

6. Sew Unit 2 to the large square, as shown.




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
Unit 5

7. Sew Unit 3 to Unit 4. You will need to make 16 Unit 5 blocks.



Unit 6

8. Combine 4—Unit 5 blocks with 4—rectangles and 1 small square, as shown. You will make 4—Unit 6 blocks. Trim to 14 ½".








Center Block Assembly

1. Sew together your center block using 4—6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares, 1—2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square, and 4—2 $\frac{1}{2}$ "W x 7"H rectangle. Trim to 14 ½".







Assemble the Quilt Top

- 1. Lay out blocks as shown in quilt diagram. Sew blocks together into rows. Press seams to one side.
- Sew rows together. Press seams in opposite directions 2.

Quilting and Finishing

- Layer batting between quilt top and backing.
- 2. Pin or baste layers together.
- 3. Quilt as desired.
- Add binding, mitering corners.
