FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

- Background fabric—11/8 yards
- Border fabric—5/8 yard for appliqué, inner border and binding
- Appliqué fabrics—scraps, fat quarters, or 1/8 yard cuts; model used 28 different pinks
- Fusible web—1 yard
- Backing fabric—1 yard
- Batting-34" square

CUTTING DIRECTIONS

Background Fabric:

- Cut 1—25" square
- Cut 4—2½" strips across the width of the fabric (WOF) for outer border

Border Fabric:

- Cut 4—1½" strips across WOF for inner border
- Cut 3—2½" strips across WOF for binding



Appliqué Fabrics: Apply fusible web before cutting.

- Cut 8—4" hearts with fusible web backing
- Cut 8—3" hearts with fusible web backing
- Cut 12—2" hearts with fusible web backing

SEWING DIRECTIONS

- 1. Lightly press horizontal, vertical and diagonal centers of background square.
- 2. Remove paper backing from all appliqué shapes.
- 3. Lay background square on pressing surface.
- 4. Position four, 4" hearts on background square center using diagram and pressed centers as a guide. Points of hearts should meet in center.
- 5. Add 3" hearts into points of 4" hearts aligning center of hearts on horizontal and vertical pressed guides.
- 6. Add 3" hearts between 4" hearts aligning center of hearts with diagonal pressed guides.
- 7. Continue to add 2" and 4" hearts to complete appliqué design.
- 8. Fuse in place following manufacturer's directions.
- 9. Machine appliqué around heart shapes using a narrow zigzag stitch and matching thread.
- 10. Press background square.
- 11. Trim to 23" square, centering appliqué.
- 12. Trim two, $1\frac{1}{2}$ " inner border strips to 23".
- 13. Pin and sew trimmed inner borders to sides of background square matching center of inner border to center of square edge.
- 14. Press seams toward inner borders.





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- 15. Measure horizontal center of background square with side inner borders. Trim two, $1\frac{1}{2}$ " inner border strips to this measurement.
- 16. Pin and sew trimmed inner border strips to top and bottom of quilt center matching center of inner border to center of square.
- 17. Press seams toward inner borders.
- 18. Measure vertical center of guilt center. Trim two, 2½" outer border strips to this measurement.
- 19. Pin and sew trimmed outer border strips to sides of quilt center matching center of outer border to center of quilt edge.
- 20. Measure horizontal center of quilt with side inner borders. Trim two, $2\frac{1}{2}$ " outer border strips to this measurement.
- 21. Pin and sew trimmed outer border strips to top and bottom of quilt center matching center of outer border to center of quilt edge.
- 22. Press seams toward inner border.
- 23. Position and fuse four, 2" hearts to corners of inner border as shown on quilt diagram.
- 24. Machine appliqué around heart shapes using a narrow zigzag stitch and matching thread.

QUILTING AND FINISHING

- 1. Remove any markings and press quilt top.
- 2. Layer batting between quilt top and backing.
- 3. Pin or baste layers together.
- 4. Quilt as desired. Model was machine-quilted with medium stippling in background areas with matching thread.
- 5. Remove any markings and press quilt if desired.
- Bind quilt with 2½" border fabric strips, mitering corners. Add hanging sleeve if desired.
