GO! Project Idea Assembly Instructions

blazing star by Eleanor Burns

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
Designed by Eleanor Burns featuring True Blue fabrics

A word of fabric selection from Eleanor:

Select one fabric for background (Shape A). Choose a medium and dark fabric in the same color for the outer points of the star that point to the corners of the block (Shape B). Choose a medium and dark fabric in a second color for the inner star (Shape C.) One fabric should read solid from a distance and the second should have some appearance of texture.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

- Fabric A—¾ yard fabric for background
- Fabric B—7/8 yard fabric for medium outer star points and lattice
- Fabric B—¾ yard fabric for dark outer star points and cornerstones
- Fabric C—3/8 yard fabric for medium inner star
- Fabric C—²/₃ yard fabric for dark inner star and binding
- Backing fabric—1 yard
- Batting—35" square



CUTTING DIRECTIONS

Tip: Cut and sew one block before cutting entire project.

- Fabric A (background fabric):
- Cut 16 pairs of Shape A

Fabric B (medium outer star points):

- Cut 16—Shape B placed on die wrong sides up
- Cut 4—2¹/₂" strips across the width of the fabric for lattice
- Fabric B (dark outer star points):
 - Cut 16—Shape B placed on die right sides up
- Cut 9—2¹/₂" squares for cornerstones

Fabric C (medium inner star triangles):

• Cut 16—Shape C placed on die wrong sides up

Fabric C (dark inner star triangles):

- Cut 16—Shape C placed on die right sides up
- 0 Cut 4—2¹/₂" strips across the width of fabric for binding

SEWING DIRECTIONS

- Sew seam one thread width less than a ¼". Lay out shapes for one quarter block. Place four in each.
- 2. Pin and sew dark B to background A together as shown.
- 3. Press seams toward dark B. Make four.
- 4. Pin and sew medium C to edge of combined A/dark B unit.
- 5. Press seams toward combined A/dark B unit. Make four.
- 6. Pin and sew background A and medium B together.
- 7. Press seams toward background A. Make four.



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8. Pin and sew dark C to edge of combined A/medium B unit.

- 9. Press seams toward dark C. Make four.
- 10. Pin and sew combined units to form one quarter-block unit.
- 11. Press seams toward medium B/dark C unit. From right sides, trim corners even with block. Make four.
- 12. Lay out four quarter-block units.
- 13. Pin and sew two quarter-block units together to form half blocks.
- 14. Press seams toward medium C fabric.
- 15. Pin and sew two half blocks together to complete block.
- 16. Press seams to create a pinwheel in the center (see box.)
- 17. Make four blocks.

Swirling Center Seams

- 1. Place block on pressing mat wrong side up.
- 2. Remove three straight stitches inseam allowances.
- 3. Push top vertical seam to right, and bottom vertical seam to left. Center will pop open and make a little pinwheel.
- 4. Press center flat with your finger. Press so seams swirl around center clockwise.
- 5. Press block flat from right side.




SEWING TOP TOGETHER

- Measure blocks and find average size. Trim 12 Fabric B, 2¹/₂" lattice strips to average measurement. (i.e., 2¹/₂" x 12¹/₂")
- 2. Lay out four blocks with lattice and cornerstones.
- 3. Pin and sew rows together. Press seams toward lattice.

QUILTING & FINISHING

- 1. Layer batting between quilt top and backing.
- 2. Pin or baste layers together.
- 3. Quilt as desired.
- 4. Add 2¹/₂" strips for binding, mitering corners.

Optional: Increase the size of the wall hanging by making more blocks or by adding one or more borders.



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
