The Mid-Valley Quilt Guild welcomes you to the MVQG Quilt Camp at Scottish Rite Center on **Friday and Saturday, May 15 & 16, 2026.**

Quilt Camp offers many different workshops on a variety of topics. You could learn about how to maintain your Singer Featherweight 221, managing and using your scraps in a quilt, wool applique, or even make a quilted jacket or vest. Other small projects offered are a name tag holder, burrito pillowcase, mug rugs, potholders or even a pieced animal. There will be opportunities to start quilts using multiple quilt patterns that may be new to you.

- ❖ **Classes are on a first-come, first serve basis & limited in size by the instructor and/or space.** All classes are 3 hours long. There are some classes that require **2 SESSIONS** so please note when filling out your schedule and registration.

Make a couple of mug rugs or a mug rug and a dish drying mat. Be sure to bring a quilting foot for your machine. Your drying mat is made with a purchased drying mat and 10 coordinated jelly roll strips. Batting will be provided. The mug rug is made from 4 coordinating fabrics 8”x10”.



“Strip-Pieced Jacket”

Instructions to make a strip-pieced jacket using a sweatshirt as batting and fat quarters of chosen fabric. We will piece precut fabrics together, add sweatshirt as batting and lining fabric. It is important to cut your fabric strips prior to class to enable everyone to proceed together to get as much of the jacket finished in class. Supplies include: 12 fat quarters, cut up oversized sweatshirt, optional buttons, 2 7/8 yards of optional lining fabric, ½ yd binding fabric. You will need a 6” x 24” ruler, cutting mat and cutter. Iron fabrics before class.



This 2-session class covers basic maintenance needed for your machine. It covers cleaning, oiling and lubricating moving parts, changing belt, light bulb as well as adjusting tension on bobbin and dial, cleaning exterior and some troubleshooting. **Kit Fee is \$75** and includes felt drip pan liner, replacement cushions for controller pedal and machine, new belt, LED lightbulb, silicone bed bumper, small bottle of Sew Retro machine oil and grease, cleaning brushes and micro swabs, bobbin tension meter, Featherweight oiling chart, maintenance logbook. There are multiple supplies you will need to bring as well.

You will need to piece an 18" x 18" square for the seat and an 11" x 20" rectangle for the back. Batting is not needed, if you choose to quilt it, line it with muslin.

Also needed are 3 pieces of off-white or tan flannel for interlining, 3 pieces of lining fabric that is slippery, buttons or ribbon and bias seam binding
